Our OH RR Master's Toolbox goal this year is \$13,000. Harvest Ridge has pledged an additional \$2,000.


I would like for us to set a goal for Pow Wow and also promote it throughout the year.

#### **Detailed Instructions:**

If you wish to build the cubmobile illustrated, these are step by step instructions.

#### Have Fun !!!

- 1 Cut one 2 X 4 52" for main frame.
- 2 Cut two 2 X 4's 28" for axles.
- Make an "X" on each end of each axle, and drill a hole at each "X" intersect, 6" deep using a hand electric drill (5/16" wood bit works well).
- 4 On front axle 2 X 4:
  - a Drill a 5/16" hole on each end near the back for the rope.
  - b Drill a 3/8" hole at center of 2 X 4.
  - c Attach (2) 2 X 4 blocks to front axle, on either side, 2-1/8" from center hole, use glue and #6 X 2" screws. This will limit steering.
- 1 At front of main frame 2 X 4, drill a 3/8" hole (center 1-5/8" from front).
- 2 Attach front axle to frame using 3/8" X 4" hex bolt, 4 washers, and lock nut or 2 nuts. (Tighten enough to allow steering).
- Align back axle 2 X 4 at right angle with back of main frame 2 X 4, clamp if possible. Drill (2) 5/16" holes through axle and main frame. Attach main frame to back axle using 2 carriage bolts, 2 washers, 2 lock washers, and 2 nuts. If this is to be a permanent attachment, glue also.
- 4 Cut out seat and back rest from plywood.
- 5 Cut one 2 X 4 12-14" in length for back rest support. (Bevel slightly about 5 degrees if possible).
- Attach back rest support (bevel end down) to main frame using glue and 2 screws (#8...2-1/2") at an angle. Position of this support depends on size of boy, have scout sit on 2 X 4 frame to estimate position.
- 7 Cut out 2 triangular shaped pieces of plywood and attach to either side of backrest support and main frame with glue and screws (#6 1-1/2"). Drilling small pilot holes helps.
- 8 Attach seat and back rest using glue and screws (#6...1-1/2").
- 9 Cut 2 X 2 surveyor's stake to 14-16" at an angle, cover end with rubber using nails, drill a 3/8" hole through stake at location it will meet main frame.
- 10 Drill hole 5/16" into main frame at point to attach brake. Mount brake using 3/8" X 4" lag screw and washer to side of main frame.
- 11 Drill and attach seat belt with fasteners of choice.

- 12 Attach 6-7' of 1/4" rope to front axle as shown.
- 13 Attach wheels using washers and 3/8" X 6" lag screws. (Socket wrench helps).

## POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS Heartland Conference Retreat Center

Thank you for keeping Heartland Conference Retreat Center a smoke and alcohol free environment across the entire grounds of 356 acres.

- 1. Modest swimwear is required by anyone using the pool and surrounding area. Ladies and girls must wear modest one-piece bathing suits. Men and boys must wear modest swimming trunks. At each swimming session at least one person from each group renting the pool needs to 'monitor' the bathing suits upon entrance to the pool area. Lifeguards should not be distracted by having to monitor the bathing suits.
- 2. A cover-up (not a beach towel) is to be worn to and from the pool area. The cover-up needs to be worn over bathing suits and swimming trunks anywhere on Heartland property when not at the pool area.
- 3. Swimming is allowed only when there are lifeguards on duty at the pool.
- 4. Each hour the lifeguards are required by law to take a 15 minute break. All swimmers must exit the pool during the required breaks.
- 5. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times on Heartland property.
- 6. No food or drinks are allowed inside the fenced area. Food and drinks are permitted outside the pool area.
- 7. Diving Area: Only those who pass the swimming test and have a valid wristband are permitted in the diving area. Anyone in violation of this rule will lose all pool privileges, possibly for the remainder of the scheduled event. No backward dives or flips. No swimming in the diving area. Swim to the ladder, not under the ropes. Wait for the person in front of you to get to the ladder before diving. Jump off the diving board forward, not to the side.
- 8. Swim Test Rules: You are required to swim the width of the pool on one side without stopping and swim the front crawl.
- 9. General Rules: No Running, horseplay, pushing, shoving or pulling people into the pool. No jumping or diving off the sides of the pool at any time. No food or drink inside the pool area. Stay in area of pool where you can touch bottom. No flotation devises that have a hole in the middle, such as inner tubes.
- 10. Above all the lifeguard's decision in any matter is final and will not be disputed with the patrons.

Take Exit 140, and go south on State Route 61


Turn right (west) on County Road 15 also called West Liberty Mt Vernon Road

Note: County Road 15 will go back over I-71

Turn right (north) on County Road 218 also called Berkshire-South Woodbury Road

Turn left (west) on County Road 225 also called West Liberty East Road

The entrance to Heartland is on the right!



### **FROM ROUTE 23**

Turn east on State Route 229

Note: Continue through the town of Ashley

Turn right (south) on County Road 218 also called Berkshire-South Woodbury Road

Note: you will come to a sharp left curve.

After the curve, Turn right to stay on Country Road 218

Turn right (west) on County Road 225 also called West Liberty East Road

The entrance to Heartland is on the right!
