

## The 5 R's: Sustainable Events Assessment Checklist

Use this checklist to evaluate and improve the sustainability of your incentive travel programs and events.

I. REFUSE - What can you eliminate entirely?
☐ Single-use plastic water bottles (provide reusable bottles instead)
<ul><li>Printed materials that can be digital (agendas, menus, maps)</li><li>Unnecessary swag items that will be discarded</li></ul>
<ul> <li>Over-packaging for gifts and materials</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Non-essential transportation (combine activities, choose walkable venues)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Vendors without sustainability certifications</li> </ul>

2. REDUCE - What can you minimize or scale down?
<ul> <li>Flight distances (choose closer destinations when possible)</li> <li>Food waste (accurate headcounts, smaller portions, family-style service)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Energy consumption (LED lighting, natural lighting when possible)</li> </ul>
☐ Water usage (drought-resistant venues, shorter programs)
<ul><li>□ Print quantities (digital-first approach, print on demand only)</li><li>□ Transportation emissions (group transfers, efficient routing)</li></ul>

3. REUSE - What can be used again for future events?

<ul> <li>Decorative elements (flowers, centerpieces, signage)</li> <li>Name tags and lanyards (collect at end)</li> <li>Welcome bags and totes</li> <li>Audio-visual equipment and staging</li> <li>Branded items that aren't event-date specific</li> <li>Digital content and presentations for future programs</li> </ul>

4. RECYCLE - What waste streams can you sort and process?
<ul> <li>□ Paper and cardboard collection stations</li> <li>□ Plastic bottles and containers</li> <li>□ Electronic waste (batteries, old devices)</li> <li>□ Food waste for composting programs</li> <li>□ Fabric and textile materials</li> <li>□ Metal items (cans, equipment)</li> </ul>

5. RETHINK - How can you approach this differently next time?
<ul> <li>□ Local sourcing for food, entertainment, and vendors</li> <li>□ Carbon offset programs for unavoidable emissions</li> <li>□ Digital-first communication and materials</li> <li>□ Venue selection based on sustainability certifications</li> <li>□ Community partnerships that support local economy</li> <li>□ Participant engagement in sustainability goals</li> </ul>
