


**PASTORAL PRAYER**

Beloved children of God, as we gather here this morning, we are the church! In this moment, we respond to the words of Jesus, who tells us: "...where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

And it is with the power of Christ that we proclaim that this table is open to all people — no matter who you are or what you believe or what you've been told.

Here at the Lord's table we remember the simple gathering of a chosen family that came together for a meal that proclaimed a new way of being in this world.

We remember God's radically inclusive love made real in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

## **Today's Music:**

The Bach *Flute Sonata in E-Flat* presents a wonderful opportunity for us to display not only the talent of our guest soloist, Aimee Toner, but also to feature the harpsichord that has been entrusted to us by its owner, Mr. Britt Wheeler. The harpsichord was built in 1993 by Rutkowski and Robinette and is a two-manual instrument with four registers: a 16', 8', and 4' on the lower manual; and an 8' on the upper manual (with *buff* and *nasale* effects). Patterned after the large German harpsichords of the mid-eighteenth century, this instrument is based upon the 1759 harpsichord by Johann Adolf Hass in the Yale University Collection of Musical Instruments. This harpsichord is for sale and it will reside at United Church until such time as it finds a new home.
