

# This Week's Music:

**Charles-Alexis Chauvet:** Born in Marines, France, Chauvet made his debut at the organ of St. Remi church at the age of 11. At age 13 he entered the Conservatoire de Paris to study organ with François Benoist and composition with Ambroise Thomas. He was appointed to many organist positions in France. His last appointment was in 1869 as the titular organist of the new Cavaillé-Coll organ of the Église de la Sainte-Trinité. Chauvet held this position until his premature death at the age of 34 years.

**Michael Bedford:** A full-time church musician since 1973, Dr. Bedford is an accomplished music director having led programs featuring a full graded choir program. He studied at Texas Christian University (BMus, BMusEd, and MMus), and with Michael Schneider on a Fulbright scholarship at the Hochschule für Musik in Cologne, Germany. Dr. Bedford is a Past President of the American Guild of Organists, has been a board member of the Choristers Guild, and has been active in numerous other related organizations. He is a firm believer in having young people be active in leadership positions in our churches— "...children and youth are the future of the Church."

John Blow: John Blow was an English composer and organist of the Baroque period. Appointed organist of Westminster Abbey in late 1668, his pupils included William Croft, Jeremiah Clarke and Henry Purcell. Apparently well-to-do for an organist, it is said that he owned nine houses, all in the vicinity of Westminster Abbey. Upon Blow's "retirement" from the Abbey (there is speculation that he was dismissed to make way for Purcell), he worked in several other churches in the area. The relatively short prayer anthem sung in the service today is remarkable for its text-painting on the word "incense." The pause after that word allows to the sound to rise up to the ceiling, just like incense.

**Samuel S. Wesley:** S. S. Wesley was an English organist and composer, son of the composer, Samuel Wesley. Famous in his lifetime as one of his country's leading organists and choirmasters, he composed almost exclusively for the Church of England. The popular short anthem *Lead me, Lord* sung in today's service is an extract from *Praise the Lord, O my soul.* Of his hymn tunes the best known are "Aurelia" and "Hereford." UCG's congregation will know "Aurelia" as "The Church's One Foundation." Wesley, with Father Willis, can be credited with the invention of the concave and radiating organ pedalboard. This joint conception has been largely adopted as an international standard for organs throughout the English-speaking world. UCG's Hillebrand organ has a flat pedalboard, and not the concave radiating "AGO Standard" pedalboard, following an earlier style of organ building.
