CALL TO CONFESSION


PRAYER OF CONFESSION

This Week's Music:



Herbert Norman Howells (17 October 1892—23 February 1983) was an English composer, organist, and teacher, most famous for his large output of Anglican church music. His father was a plumber, painter, decorator, and builder, but also the organist at a local Baptist church. At an early age, Howells substituted for his father and at the age of eleven moved on to the local Church of

England parish church as choirboy and unofficial deputy organist. Howells was deeply affected by the death of his nine-year-old son, Michael. His son contracted polio during a family holiday and died in London three short days later. Herbert Howells commemorated the death of his son in music until the end of his own life. We are singing Howells' most famous hymn today *All My Hope on God is Founded*, with the tune named after his son. Both anthems in the service today are meditative, one focusing on heavenly love, and the offertory anthem on our yearning for a glimpse of heaven. Both anthems are in a very beautiful singing style with individual chant-like lines intertwining. All four parts coalesce at the moments in the text that relate to love and heaven. Musical word-painting at its finest.



Emma Lou Diemer was born in Kansas City, MO. Her father was an educator and college president; her mother was a church worker and homemaker. Diemer played the piano and composed at a very early age and became organist in her church at age 13. She majored in composition at the Yale School of Music and at the Eastman School of Music. She also studied in Brussels on a Fulbright Scholarship and spent two summers of composition

study at the Berkshire Music Center. Diemer has composed several pieces based on the psalms, a kind of "song without words" for the organ. These pieces are in varied styles, by turns meditative, tumultuous, vigorous, and playful. Today's Psalm 128 is in a stately, march-like setting with contrasting sections in a syncopated style.
