



Barbara Ann Titley 75, was a longtime resident of Norwalk, CT and most recently of Madison, CT. Barbara was born in Stamford, CT on March 21, 1947, daughter of the late Jack Titley and Dorothy (Billings) Titley, beloved sister of Dennis Titley and his wife Kathryn Thomas of Branford CT, and Robert Titley and his wife Yvonne Ward of Nampa, ID. Barbara is also survived by nephews Joshua Titley of Ball Ground GA, Christopher Wolf of New Haven, CT and Kenneth Titley of Sacramento, CA, four great-nephews, and many cousins.

Barbara lived in Norwalk, CT for most of her life except for a four year period in Switzerland. Under the care of STAR, Inc., Barbara was employed in workshop settings and in the STAR cafeteria where she prepared lunches. She also participated in many community and local social events. After the death of her mother in 1986 Barbara was able to live in her own apartment with supervision by STAR staff for many years. Though dogs were not permitted, Barbara was allowed a pair of cats (Sugar and Spice!) who she loved dearly. In 2017, under the auspices of SARAH-TUXIS, Barbara moved to Madison, CT where she lived in a group home and participated in a much beloved day program in Westbrook, CT.

She loved her group home housemates, her house staff and the staff at her day program. Her love of animals (especially dogs!) was evident in nearly every conversation with her. Barbara was always surrounded by loving caring people at SARAH-TUXIS and loved them very much in return. On special occasions she also enjoyed attending worship services at United Church on the Green with Dennis, Kathryn, and Christopher. Barbara was much beloved by her immediate family and extended family of nephews and cousins both near and far.

Barbara's family will be eternally grateful to all of Barbara's caregivers who demonstrated kindness and compassion over the years, especially those at SARAH-TUXIS and her many advocates at the CT Department of Developmental Services. At United Church on the Green, we seek to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God, following in the footsteps of Jesus. We are also a progressive Protestant Christian church, a member of the nationwide United Church of Christ (UCC).

We have a long history.
