Today's Music



Florence Beatrice Price was an American classical composer, pianist, organist and music teacher. Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, Price was educated at the New England Conservatory of Music, and was active in Chicago from 1927 until her death in 1953. She won first prize in the Wanamaker Competition with her Symphony in E minor and as a result, became the first female composer of African descent to have a symphonic work performed by a major national symphony orchestra.

Price composed over 300 works. In addition to her orchestral music, she composed chamber works, art songs, piano and organ music, and she arranged instrumental and vocal versions of Spirituals. Price's musical style is often conservative, reflecting the romantic, nationalist style of the 1920s—1940s. Much of her instrumental music also reflects the influence of her cultural heritage, incorporating Spirituals, Spiritual-like themes, and characteristic dance music within classical forms.
