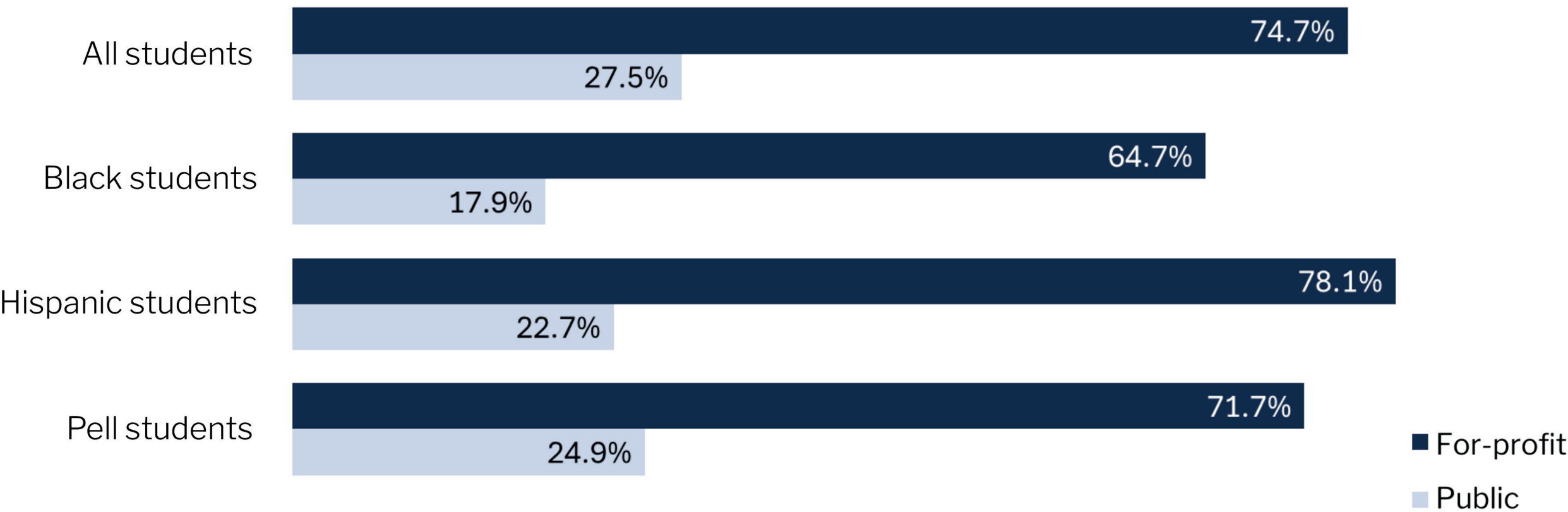


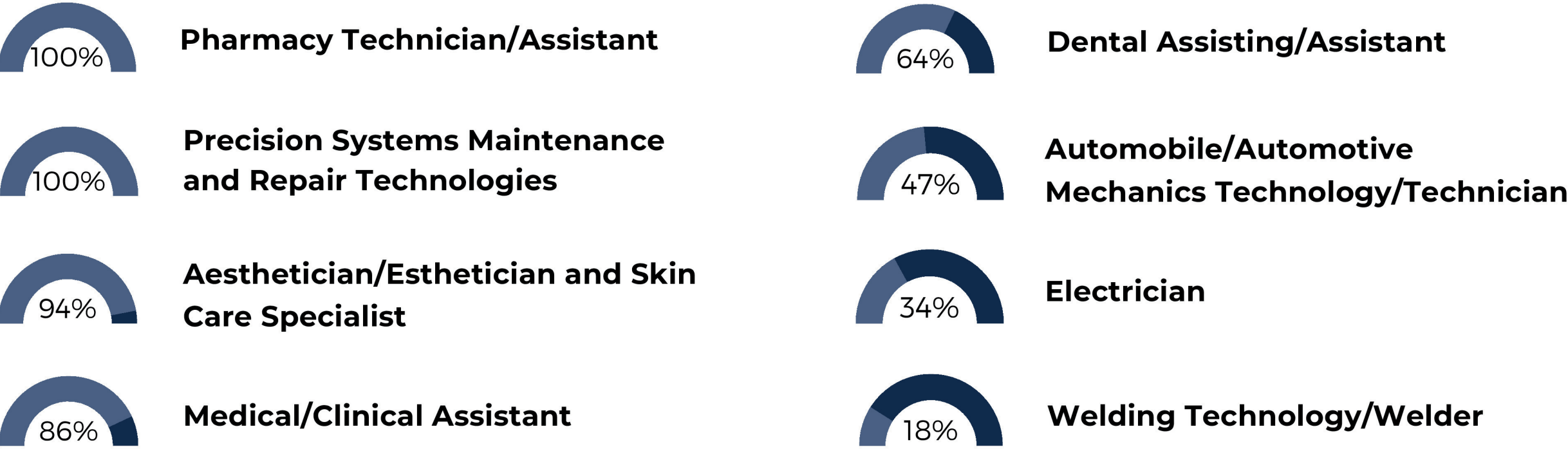
Student Success at For-Profit Schools in New York

For-profit colleges in New York contribute significantly to the U.S. workforce to fill critical roles by conferring a high percentage of degrees/certificates in the following fields:

For-profit colleges in New York support historically underserved populations across the state, by offering career-focused education to a high percentage of these groups:

- **74%** of for-profit students in the 2023–24 school year were women
- **49%** of for-profit students in the 2023–24 school year received Pell Grants
- **30%** of for-profit students in 2023–24 school year were Black
- **26%** of for-profit students in 2023–24 school year were Hispanic
- **26%** of for-profit students in Fall 2024 were over the age of 25
