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

Diverse Populations Served: Female




First, we look at the percentage of women enrolled at forprofit colleges in Nevada in the 2022-23 school year. Forprofit colleges lead the way in female enrollment with 76% of enrolled students identifying as female.

Across all institutional levels. CECU member schools had an average enrollment of approximately 74% women.





Additionally, for-profit colleges had the highest enrollment of students that are Black (18%) and the second-highest enrollment of students that are Hispanic (32%).

At CECU member schools in Nevada, 49% of enrolled students identified as Black or Hispanic.




Diverse Populations Served: Low-Income

Low Income

Other areas of underserved populations accommodated by for-profit colleges in Nevada include low-income students. For-profit colleges served the second-highest percentage of low-income students in the 2022-23 school year with 65% of enrolled students qualifying as low-income.

CECU member schools in Nevada enrolled 66% low-income students across all institutional levels.





Diverse Populations Served: First-Generation

For-profit colleges also served a large share of first-generation students in the 2022-23 school year, leading the way in first-generation enrollment with 53% of students being among the first generation in their family to attend college.

CECU member schools enrolled 54% first-generation students.




Diverse Populations Served: Adult Learners

Adults aged 25+ are another key population served by for-profit colleges in Nevada as schools in this sector aim to adapt to the needs of older, more experienced learners that may have competing priorities as they've gotten older.

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For-profit colleges had a higher enrollment of adult learners in the 2022-23 school year (48%) than public colleges (30%). Data for private nonprofit colleges is not available.





Degrees Awarded in Nevada


Academic year 2021–22

For-profit colleges conferred all less-than-two-year and two-year degrees/certificates across sectors in the 2021-22 school year. They also conferred 3% of four-year degrees/certificates.



Among Black and Hispanic students, for-profit colleges again conferred all less-than-two-year and two-year degrees/certificates. They also accounted for 3% of four-year degrees/certificates conferred to Black and Hispanic students.

For-profit colleges contribute significantly to the workforce in Nevada, conferring over 95% of degrees/certificates in the following fields:



Projected Shortage of Workers by Group



The degrees/certificates conferred by for-profit colleges in Nevada align very well with the estimated annual nationwide worker shortages in occupations requiring some college or a postsecondary nondegree award. Healthcare is by far the occupation most in need of workers. For-profit colleges in Nevada confer a large percentage of degrees/certificates in the following healthcare-related fields:

- Medical/Clinical Assistants (96%)
- Dental Assisting/Assistant (90%)
- Phlebotomy Technician/Phlebotomist (85%)
- Licensed Practical/Vocational nurse (49%)
- Registered nursing/registered nurse (19%)
