


Diverse Populations Served: Female



First, we look at the percentage of women enrolled at for-profit colleges in Texas the 2022-23 school year. For-profit colleges conferring primarily four-year degrees lead the way at their institutional level at 76% female enrollment while less-than-two-year for-profit colleges lead the way in their level with just over 69% female enrollment. Across all institutional levels, CECU members boasted an average enrollment of approximately 67% women.



Diverse Populations Served: Students of Color



Additionally, all levels of for-profit colleges in Texas, as well as CECU members, served around 20% Black students as of the 2022-23 school year. They also served over 40% Hispanic students at all institutional levels.


Black and Hispanic enrollment was higher at 4year and 2-year for-profit schools compared to public and private nonprofit institutions.

Low Income

Other areas of underserved populations accommodated by for-profit colleges in Texas include low-income students. For-profit colleges served the highest percentages of low-income students in the 2022-23 school year at less-than-two-year (79%) and four-year (64%) colleges.






Degrees Awarded in Texas

Academic year 2022-23

For-profit colleges in Texas conferred the bulk of less-than-two-year completions across all sectors, accounting for 99% of all less-than-two-year degrees/certificates conferred in the 2022-23 school year.



For-profit colleges in Texas also conferred the bulk of less-than-two-year degrees/certificates to Black and Hispanic students, accounting for 98% of all less-than-two-year degrees/certificates conferred in the 2022-23 school year.



For-profit colleges contribute significantly to the workforce in Texas, conferring over half of degrees/certificates in the following fields:

- Medical/Clinical Assistant (86.5%)
- Dental Assisting/Assistant (83.3%)
- Cosmetology/Cosmetologist, General (69.0%)
- Electrician (54.5%)

Projected Shortage of Workers by Group



The degrees/certificates conferred by for-profit colleges in Texas align very well with the estimated annual nationwide worker shortages in occupations requiring some college or a postsecondary nondegree award. Healthcare is by far the occupation most in need of workers. In helping to meet this need, for-profit colleges confer nearly **one out of every five** degrees/certificates in licensed practical/vocational nurse training and 10% in registered nursing in Texas. They also confer 87% of degrees/certificates to medical/clinical assistants in Texas.

Installation, maintenance, and repair occupations are also in need of workers. Texas for-profit schools provide large percentages of degrees/certificates in the following fields to meet that need:


- Electrician (55%)
- Airframe Mechanics and Aircraft Maintenance Technology/Technician (49%)
- Automobile/Automotive Mechanics Technology/Technician (43%)
- Welding Technology/Welder (39%)
- HVACR Technology/Technician (93%)

Student Debt in Texas

Academic year 2021-22

Not only do for-profit colleges in Texas confer valuable degrees to fill gaps in the labor market, but they do so in a way that minimizes student debt for those who obtained less-than-two-year degrees/certificates. For-profit college graduates from less-than-two-year colleges showed the lowest student debt (\$9,118) compared to other institutions of the same level.

CECU member schools had an average student debt of \$12,260 across all institutional levels.
