
Mission

Our Authors Study Club, Inc.

Vassie Davis Wright and a group of Terminal Annex Postal employees organized Our Authors Study Club, Inc. (OASC) on February 14, 1945 to study the writings of African American authors, to review books, and to learn the authentic history of Africans in the Americas.

Mrs. Wright identified what was called the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, Inc. (ASNLH) as the premier African American history organization. She contacted ASNLH for membership information, and by June 1945, Dr. Carter G. Woodson the Founder and "Father of Black History" himself issued the membership charter declaring OASC as the Los Angeles Branch of ASNLH.

Dr. Woodson and his association established Negro History Week in February 1926. OASC first celebrated Negro History Week in February 1947 and in February 1950 the celebration became a citywide event when Los Angeles Mayor Fletcher Bowron issued the first proclamation recognizing OASC as the official sponsor for the celebration. Every succeeding Mayor has maintained this tradition.

In the 1970s ASNLH. changed its name to the Association for the Study of African American Life and History, Inc. (ASALH); and Negro History Week became Black History Month in February 1976, during the nation's bicentennial year. As a 501(c) (3) non-profit California organization and local branch of ASALH. OASC provides resources for celebration of African American History 365 days a year. We rely on the support of individual and corporate gifts for research fellowships, scholarships and special programs that advance our mission to collect, preserve and interpret African American life and history.
