

The study was published on Monday in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, or PNAS, a journal that recently drew controversy for publishing another study on police killing disparities. That <u>study</u>, led by Michigan State University psychology professor Joseph Cesario, published on July 22, found that <u>violent crime rates and the racial demographics of a given location</u> are better indicators for determining a police killing victim's race.
