What is a Paraprofessional?

The Virginia Department of Education defines a paraprofessional as a "....school employee who works under the supervision of a licensed staff member to assist in providing instruction and other services to children, youth, and families."

- "Paras" work in a variety of instructional and non-instructional roles
- Paraprofessionals work in education settings ranging from preschool and daycare to adult vocational sites
- Paras are essential parts of a team, providing direct and indirect services to students with disabilities*

Highly Qualified Paras are in Great Demand!

All school systems in the Commonwealth of Virginia use paras. PRACEP is offering a 6-month intensive program aimed at training a select number of candidates to become certified paraprofessionals. Paras receive good benefits and job security, along with opportunities for career advancement.

CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS: This program requires a 6-month commitment. Priority will be given to candidates in need of completing their GED[®]. Recent GED[®] "graduates" will also be considered. Training will require a commitment of 6-8 hours/week, usually evenings with occasional Saturdays. Training is intensive and factors such as child-care, work schedules, and other commitments should be carefully considered prior to engaging with this program.

Successful PluggedIn Para completers will obtain:

• GED[®]

- Paraprofessional certification (based on passing the para exam)
- CPR & First Aid Certification
- Word Processing / Spreadsheet Certification
- Workplace and job search skills enabling candidates to seamlessly transition into the para role
