09:45 - Digital Interoperability with APASS and precision targeting

David "Manny" Ramsey, DPSS Technical Director, NAVAIR, US Navy

The brief will cover the top level of who DPSS is (Digital Precision Strike Suite Team), and will talk a little history of PSS-SOF and how we got to where we are with two main product lines now.

- DIEEE (Digital Imagery Exploitation Engine), our Window product line that integrates the DOD's only approved Collateral Damage Estimation software (DCIDE) as a module in DIEEE. DIEEE also is NGA validated for several mensuration capabilities and was recently selected by the US Airforce as the Advanced Targeting Tool suite of record.
- KILSWITCH our baseline Android software is also NGA validated with PSS-SOF Mobile imbedded inside, to allow dismounted operators to generate precision coordinates either with stereo pairs or with PFI (Precision Fires Images). Two offshoot derivations of KILSWITCH are the FMS and SOF version called APASS (Android Precision Assault Strike Suite) which had many additional features like DACAS capabilities integrated with Staudertech's MJECL software, and the USMC Infantry Program of Record version called MAGTF Common Handheld (MCH).
