What will you be doing in England?

During our journey, we enjoy a private inner stone circle experience at Stonehenge and visit the vast ceremonial landscape of Avebury Stone Circle, the ancient chambered tomb of West Kennet Long Barrow, and the mysterious prehistoric mound of Silbury Hill.

In Glastonbury, we climb the Tor, walk, pray, and meditate in the Chalice Well and Peace Gardens, sing, pray, or meditate within the sacred waters of the White Spring, and spend an evening at the Glastonbury Goddess Temple for a meditation and talk devoted to meeting the Lady of Avalon. Two free days offer time to explore Glastonbury and the surrounding area at your own pace.

Along the rugged Cornish coast, we visit Tintagel, traditionally known as the birthplace of King Arthur and the location of Merlin's Cave, with an optional stop at the Museum of Witchcraft and Magic in Boscastle. We also journey to St. Nectan's Glen for a long woodland walk beside the River Trevillet, leading to its magnificent sixty-foot waterfall, where we commune with the faery realm and the living spirit of the land.

In the historic city of Bath, we explore the Roman Baths Museum, where steaming thermal waters, ancient temple ruins, sacred offerings, and the enduring presence of the Goddess Sulis Minerva reveal the city's Roman and Celtic past. We enjoy lunch in the elegant neoclassical Pump Room before swimming in the open-air Cross Bath during a private catered gathering with delightful desserts, fresh fruit, cheeses, and champagne or juice.

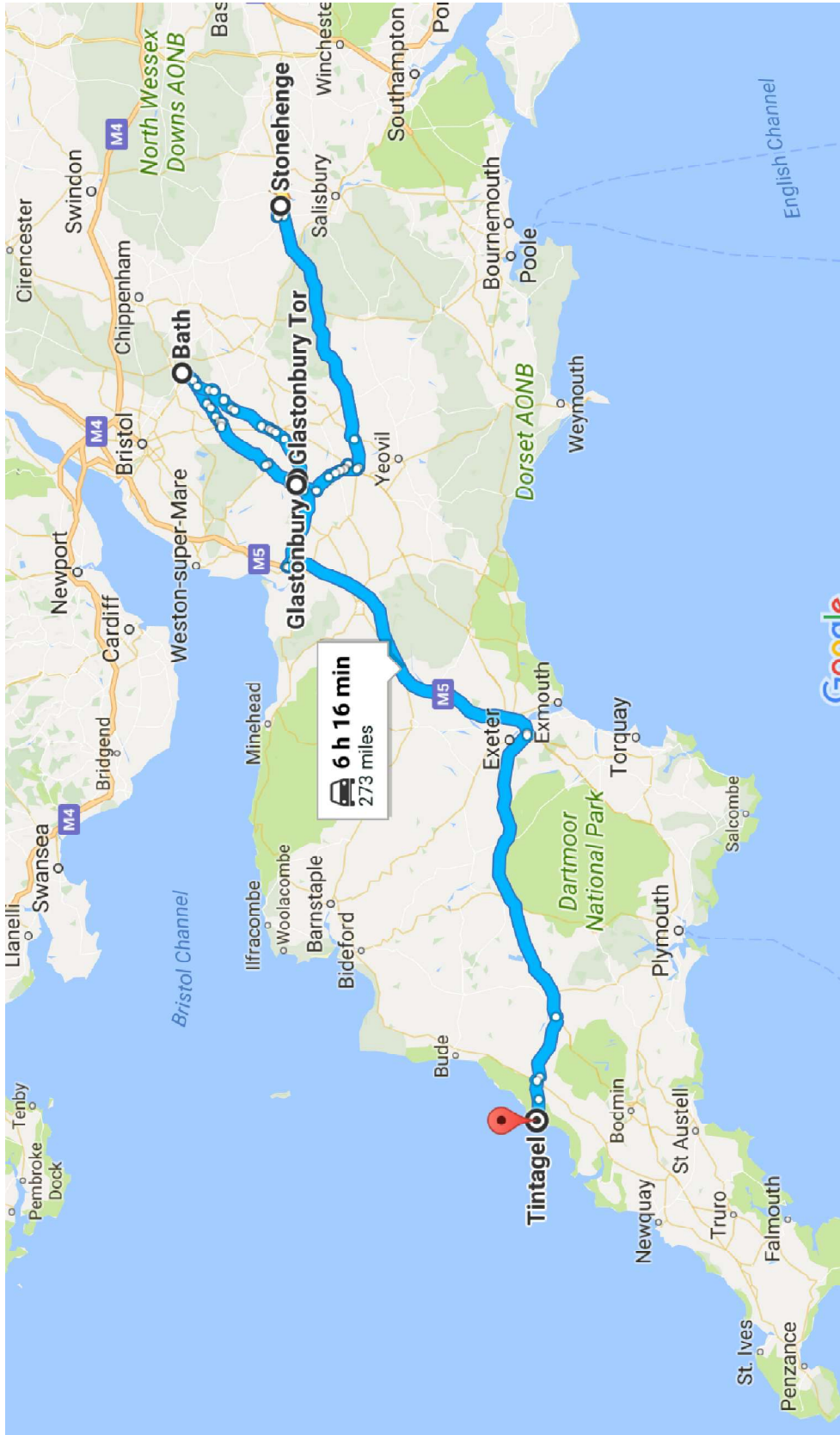

Telephones and Cell Phone Service

Important to contact your cell phone provider to make sure they set you up on an International, phone, text and data service! Turn Roaming Feature on!

Telephone dialing code out of the UK is: OO followed by the country area code of where you are dialing.

If you are using your own cell phone just dial as you normally would in your own country. If you are making a call from your cell phone to a U.K. number hold down the 0 to get the + symbol, then 44 followed by the number. If someone gives you a phone number from the U.K. that starts with a 0 drop the zero.

Example: CJW Taxis from a U.K. number is 01458 833106. If you are dialing from your cell phone do it this way. +44 1458 833106. I know it is confusing, but you will get use to it. Remember to get the + symbol, you just need to hold down the 0 (zero) on your cell phone till it pops up automatically then dial the rest of your number.

There are many free ways to make calls internationally now from your cell phone. Try some of the phone apps. I use WhatsApp, Skype, Facetime, Magic Jack, Facebook Messenger, Signal, etc, for international calls as this is much less expensive for you.

Texting and Video

Go text and video crazy with Tik Tok, Facebook, X, Instagram, or normal texting that goes with your cell phone service. Share with your friends the fun you are having.

Wi-fi connection

You will have Wi-fi access in your apartment. Check with your cell phone provider for roaming data and prices. Get a package for traveling internationally before you leave for England.

The library and restaurants have Wi-fi too.

Weather in England in Summer!

What to wear!

The weather in England has been changeable but sunny so best to be prepared. Warm days maybe mixed with some rain. Dress in layers. Have a sturdy footwear. Suggested one pair of hiking shoes and one pair of athletic shoes. **Bring your swimsuit** for our trip to the Cross Bath!

Take a collapsible umbrella, rain slicker and sweater no matter when you go. Britain an island country and the surrounding sea gives England a varied climate. We never know what the weather will be like from one day to the other. It can be sunny one day and rainy the next. As we have such a variable climate changing from day to day, it is difficult to predict the weather.

The overall climate in England is called temperate maritime. This means that it is mild with temperatures not much lower than 0°C or 32° F in winter and not much higher than 30°C or 86 °F in summer. It also means that it is damp and is subject to frequent changes.

The Sun and Moon

Sunrise is at 06:14 a.m. and sunset is at 7:48 p.m. approx.

For Glastonbury, England, from September 1 through September 8, 2026, the lunar timing should be read in UK local time, which is BST, UTC+1.

The Moon enters Taurus on September 1, 2026, at approximately 8:01 AM BST, and remains in Taurus through September 2 and into the morning of September 3. This brings a grounded, earthy, Venusian quality to the opening days of the journey, which feels especially fitting for Glastonbury's landscape, sacred springs, and body-based pilgrimage energy.

The Moon enters Gemini on September 3, 2026, at approximately 11:47 AM BST. This shifts the tone into movement, conversation, learning, travel, and exchange. By September 4, the Moon reaches the Third Quarter phase at approximately 8:51 AM BST, marking the turning point into the waning cycle.

The Moon then moves into Cancer around September 5, bringing a softer, more inward, emotional, and intuitive quality. This is especially resonant for Glastonbury's Avalon energy, with its associations of water, memory, healing, ancestry, and the sacred feminine.

Around September 7, the Moon moves into Leo, shifting the energy outward again into expression, creativity, confidence, and visibility as the journey approaches its close on September 8.

The New Moon occurs later, on September 11, 2026, at approximately 4:26 AM BST. During September 1–8, there will still be visible moonlight, especially later at night and into the early morning hours. Even so, anyone walking to the Tor in the evening should bring a torch, as the paths are unlit and uneven, and visibility can change quickly with cloud cover.

Shopping in Glastonbury

Shopping in Glastonbury is like something out of a Harry Potter film. Think Diagon Alley. Crystals, wands and spells, gorgeous Goddessy things and lovely Goddess clothes and great candles. Fairy wings and masks are a must!

Glastonbury is not too practical on the everyday stuff unless you are a practicing witch or Priestess.

A village called Street is about a mile away and has a retail outlet and is great for discounted clothes.

You will have also an opportunity to shop in Bath, the crown jewel of England. Likely, you will find little things to buy on your free days in Glastonbury and the various cities we visit.

Banks, ATM's and Currency

What kind of currency should I use in England?

Answer: The Sterling British Pound.

When we go to England make sure you have both pounds in cash and at least two debit or credit cards, possibly multiple cards, to protect you from loss,

theft, or mistakes with your account's. Never travel without some cash and cards.

Make sure your banks know you will be in England and what days you are traveling. This will ensure they will allow funds to be released while you are travelling through that country.

Banks are much more careful with international transactions due to theft. Many banks block financial transactions from other countries to protect you and your assets. Bring your bank's phone number with you!

Order your currency in advance from your local bank or visit a currency exchange center in your state. Exchange centers are also available at most airports but make sure you to get your money in-advance, so you aren't rushing around at the last minute, only to find the currency exchange kiosk is closed or out of the British Pound. It can happen.

What if I need more cash later?

You can also get cash from ATM machines in England

Glastonbury ATM and Banks: There are only one or two ATM machines near your apartment. Morrison's Supermarket has a ATM machine. ATM machines do charge a fee. Your banks will likely also charge you a fee as well. It is cheaper to use your cash for purchases and pay only one fee. It is a good idea to keep cash on hand in any situation.

PLEASE make sure you are prepared with some cash before you go to the airport. All restaurants and shops take cash, credit and debit cards.

Tipping

Tipping is appreciated in the United Kingdom but is not compulsory. For taxis, round up the fare or tip approximately 10%. In restaurants, a tip of 10–12.5% is customary for good table service unless a service charge has already been added to the bill. For a private driver, approximately 10% of the fee or a group gratuity presented at the end of the journey is appropriate.

Safety in the UK

Many people – including those who say they are in excellent shape – sometimes struggle with walking the hillsides and have found themselves just dehydrated getting around this area. So sturdy walking shoes, lots of and plenty of time for breaks, if you need them. Bring bottled water with you on day trips.

Please keep your personal belongings safe and do not leave them unattended.

Walking after dark in Glastonbury is generally considered safe and many people go up to the Tor at night.

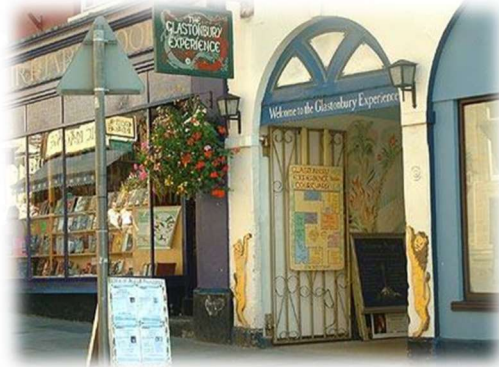

Day 3: September 3, Thursday

Good sturdy walking shoes required

Gradient Level Today: 1-5

Bring a sack lunch and or snacks.

The Tor: (Gradient Level 3-5) **Participants will meet and walk to St Dunstan's Car Park** next to the Abbey and Glastonbury Visitor Center a **9:45 a.m.** Ride the 10:00 a.m. (10:04 a.m.) Tor Bus to the Tor. The Tor is a symbol of the Mother and is our first stop. It is a place where the veil is thin between the worlds. It was an Islet for centuries, as the floodwaters took a long time to recede. In ancient times, it was called the Island of Glass and connected to the mainland by only a narrow strip of land at low tide called Ponter's Ball.



The Tor, St. Michael's Tower

The Tor is an axis point where many energetic ley lines cross. Legend says, it is considered a soul portal, a place for spirits to transition between the worlds, a powerful vortex of natural and spiritual power. The clearest map indicated 57 major alignments radiate from or pass through the Glastonbury Tor.

There are two key ley lines identified as the **Michael Line** – associated with solar, masculine active energy. **The Mary Line** – associated with the lunar, feminine, receptive energy. Together they form the Michael-Mary current, sweaving across southern England and meeting around the Tor, Chalice Well, and the Glastonbury landscape.

A third alignment identified by modern dowsers is called the Walsingham Line – described as additional smaller currents.

It is called the world center and believed to have an opening within it believed to be an earthly paradise. This is considered a very sacred Goddess

site and a powerful spirit place. The site is associated with the Goddess, Fairies, Nature Spirits, King Arthur, and ETs.

Chalice Well: (Gradient Level 1-3) **12:00 noon** We visit the Chalice Well is one of Britain's most ancient wells, nestled between The Tor and Chalice Hill.

Glamourgan will lead you through the beautiful gardens and orchards. A living sanctuary, Goddesses can experience the quiet healing of this sacred place. For over 2,000 years people have gathered from around the world to drink the

water to find solace, peace, and inspiration. You may collect Chalice water to drink or for your spiritual bathing practice. Visit the gift shop and make sure all purchases are complete by 1:20 p.m.

Lunch: Picnic anywhere in the gardens. Till 1:20 p.m.

White Springs: (Gradient Level 1) **From 1:30 p.m. to 2:15 p.m. we will use the sacred well house for prayer, song, and meditation.**



White Springs

The interior of the reservoirs is dimly lit with a series of shrines to the female and male deities such as the Lady of Avalon, Goddess Bhride (Brigit), and the Stag. Inside the white springs is a large sacred pool and just above the waters is a wall that is believed to be an entry to the

otherworld. Its waters are believed

to provide healing and help release energy blocks that keep us from

expressing our true selves. Spiritual Bathing is practiced here to anyone who wishes to participate. Nudity/clothed are both possible.

Stop by the Goddess Temple on the way back. It closes at 4:00 pm

Free Time: Rest! Stay at the Chalice Well, or White Springs, go back to the Tor, or explore Glastonbury.

Day 4: September 4, Friday

Stonehenge: (Gradient Level 1-2) Enter **Stonehenge at 6:45 am** Our Private Goddess Coach will pick us up Stonehenge is one of the most famous sites in the world, Stonehenge is composed of earthworks surrounding a circular setting of large standing stones. We have **1-hour** at Stonehenge.



Stonehenge is built at the precise point where six ley lines intersect. These lines are believed by many to have magnetic and spiritual power. Stonehenge still functions as an accurate celestial calendar.

Avebury Stone Circle: (Gradient Level 1-3) **Enjoy a guided walk-through in Avebury at 10:30 a.m.**
Avebury is considered to be older than Stonehenge and much larger. You are free to wander among 100 stones, ditches, mounds, and curious patterns. A visit to Avebury is a very personal and spiritual event.

Lunch: At 12:30 p.m. the Goddesses will retire for lunch at the Red Lion Pub at Avebury Stones.

At 2:15 p.m. we travel to the West Kennet Long Barrow. This is a 10 min drive to this next location.

West Kennet Long Barrow: (Gradient Level 2-3) We will walk to the Long Barrow at 3:00 p.m. This mound is one of many prehistoric

monuments that are part of the Avebury complex of Neolithic sites. It is one of the most impressive and well-preserved burial chambers in Britain. It lines up with the rising sun on the summer solstice.

Folklore and Legend: The mound is traditionally visited by a white spectral figure accompanied by a white red-eared hound at sunrise on midsummer's day. There is a

slim possibility that this tradition is a folk memory of a ritual event or at least a time thought to have been significant in the use of the barrow. **We leave the Long Barrow at 5:00 p.m.**

Silbury Hill: (Gradient Level 1) Across the road we make a “quick stop” for 10 min. at 5:10 p.m. to this pyramid shaped hill is about 130 feet high mound of chalk. More than 4,000 years old it is considered the largest man-made object in prehistoric Europe.

Silbury Hill is one of England's mysterious ancient and religious landscapes. Legend says that the hill hid a gold statue in its center.

Wiltshire Horses: 15-minute picture stop

The Wiltshire White Horses are enormous horse figures cut into the chalk hillsides of Wiltshire. From a distance, the exposed white chalk creates the appearance of a brilliant white horse against the green countryside. Wiltshire historically had at least thirteen white-horse figures, although only about eight remain clearly visible today. Most



of the surviving horses were created during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, often near ancient hillforts and prehistoric landscapes.

During this brief scenic stop, the coach will pull into a suitable viewpoint so everyone can step out, admire one of the hillside horses, and take photographs. This will be a picture stop only, with no walk up to the horse.

The Hackpen Hill White Horse is closest to the Red Lion Pub at Avebury. . It is only about **four to five miles from Avebury** and is viewed from the A361 between Avebury and Swindon, making it a practical scenic stop from the Red Lion Pub.

Gradient Level Today: 1-5

Bring a sack lunch and or snacks. Highly suggested (Land Rover not running? Tintagel will likely be free.)

Journey to Tintagel-Cornwall and Merlin's Cave: (Gradient Level 3-5)

Goddesses meet in front of our apartment at 7:00 a.m. Our Private Goddess Coach will pick us up and take for a magical day out in Cornwall.



En route, we will make a special **stop for breakfast at 8:30 a.m.** at the **Woodleight Coach House.** We will be there at 8:30 am
After breakfast, we are on our way to Tintagel.

We arrive at the Castle at 10:30 a.m. We will take a Land Rover to the Visitor Center. Once you are given tickets you can proceed to the Castle Ruins and Merlin Cave. Visiting time is 2-hours.

The castle sits high on the rugged North Cornwall Coast. You will see it's fascinating ruins and gorgeous coast. Legend says this is the birthplace of King Arthur and you can see the nearby Merlin's Cave at low tide.



Tintagel is one of the most popular attractions in the UK. The castle has a long association with legends related to King Arthur. This began in the twelfth century when Geoffrey of Monmouth described Tintagel as the place of Arthur's conception in his fictionalized account of British history, the *Historia Regum Britanniae*. Geoffrey told the story that Arthur's father, King Uther Pendragon, was disguised by Merlin's sorcery to look like Gorlois, Duke of Cornwall, the husband of Igraine, Arthur's mother.

Visitors to Tintagel Castle can now see the sleeping face of Merlin, one of the most important characters in Arthurian legend, carved into the rocks on the beach



We will depart from the Tintagel Visitor Center at 12:15 p.m. and ride the Land Rover back to the entrance and walk to the car park for our next stop. Everyone must be in the King Arthurs Coach by 12:30 p.m.

Lunch at 12:45 p.m. in Boscastle. Visit the Boscastle Witchcraft Museum (at your own cost). Shop! The Otherworld giftshop is a must see. Sack lunch recommended for those who want to shop or visit the museum. **Be back on the coach at 2:00 p.m. Boscastle Address: The Harbour, Boscastle PL35 0HD, UK**

The Otherworld Gift Shop: This is a fabulous, otherworldly, mystical shop-extremely high-quality products including, crystals, jewelry, books, oracle/tarot cards, incense, burners, candles, and statues.

Old-fashioned customer service and handwritten receipts. No phones and no computers are used in this store. The shop is privately and locally owned by a beautiful couple. Open 7 days a week from 12 noon to 5 pm. Best shop in the U.K. for mystical shoppers. Please no pics or cell phone use inside. It is a small shop. I have been visiting this shop for over 14 years, since 2011. They are a must-see if you are in Boscastle. Don't miss this extraordinary experience. The shop provides a very personalized shopping experience one customer at a time. No, they do not have a website or social media page. Step back in time to an Otherworld.



St. Nectan's Glen Rocky Valley and Waterfall: (Gradient Level 1-5)

Arrive at St. Nectan's Glen at 2:30 p.m. Walk through the tea gardens and see this 60-ft. waterfall reputed to be in the top ten of the most spiritual sites in the country. **Address: Trethevy, Tintagel PL34 0BG, UK**



St. Nectan was a hermit who gave his name to the glen and waterfall. Although, according to some sources the name is a Christianized form of the Cornish water god - Nectan.

The keive, was seen as a potent Pagan symbol of Gaia and has been a place of reverence since before Christ. St. Nectan was said to have lived here and reputedly lies buried under the stones of the basin.

On the coach and leave for St. Nectan's Glen at 5:00 p.m. and back to our apartment by 20:00 p.m. (8:00 p.m.)

Day 6: September 6, Sunday

Free Day Enjoy and experience a free day in Glastonbury and the surrounding area or revisit places you saw yesterday. If you are leaving the city please hire a taxi 2-days in advance. See the taxi listing above on page 5.

There is also a bus system to Wells and back but that might be a little confusing. Go to the Glastonbury Visitor Center for transportation information. The center is next to the car park on Magdalene Street.

Comfortable Walking Shoe – Bring Your Swimsuit

Gradient Level Today: 1-2

Journey to the City of Bath: Goddesses will meet at in front of our apartment at 8:00 a.m. and travel to Bath by coach. Bath is a city in the ceremonial county of Somerset. **We will arrive at 9:30 a.m.**

The Roman Bath Museum: (Gradient Level 1-2) **Enter the Museum at 10:00 a.m.** for a self-guided tour. Romans built baths and a temple on the surrounding hills of Bath in the valley of the River Avon around hot springs, which are the only naturally occurring ones in the UK.



Roman Baths

A private ceremony and private bath at the spa will be arranged to honor the Goddess Minerva and Spiritual Bathing. The four key features are: The Sacred Spring, The Roman Temple, The Roman Bath House and the Museum. It is one of the 7 Natural Wonders of the West Country. An audio guide is available.

Goddess Sulis Minerva

The gilt bronze head of the Goddess Sulis Minerva is one of the best-known objects from Roman Britain. Its discovery in 1727 was an early indication that the Roman site at Bath was not a typical settlement. Gilt bronze sculptures are rare finds from Roman Britain as only two other fragments are known.



The head is probably from the cult statue of the deity which would have stood within her Temple beside the Sacred Spring. From there she may have looked out across the Temple courtyard to the site of the great altar, the site of sacrifice, which stood at the heart of that sacred space. The statue may well be an original object from the

foundation of the site in the later first century AD, which means that it was probably well over three hundred years old when it met its demise.

Grand Pump Room

Lunch at the Pump Room: Reservations have been made for 12:00 noon. The Pump Room is regarded as the social heart of Bath for more than two centuries, the Pump Room is a striking neo-classical salon where hot Spa water is drawn for drinking. The Pump Room is very elegant and sophisticated for fine dining.



The Grand Pump Room in the Abbey Church Yard, Bath, Somerset, England is a historic building.

The main block, built of Bath stone, was begun in 1789 by Thomas Baldwin. He resigned in 1791 and John Palmer continued the scheme from 1793. It was finally finished in 1799. The facade of the building features Corinthian half columns, perhaps an influence from the Temple at Bassae.

Situated next to main street entrance to the Roman Baths, visitors can sample the waters from the warm spring which fills the Roman Baths. The restaurant, is popular to sample the afternoon tea and freshly prepared meals. Music in the restaurant is provided by the Pump Room Trio—the longest established resident ensemble in Europe or by a pianist.



Cross Bath

We will walk to the Cross Bath at 1:45 p.m. and enter the Cross Bath at 2:00 p.m. We have reserved the Cross Bath for 1.5 hours. The Cross Bath is an intimate open-air thermal bath with its own changing facilities. The Cross Bath is a separate building and provides an alternative to the more extensive spa facilities in the New Royal Bath.



Where the Cross Bath now stands, the Celts revered their Goddess Sulis, in whose honor the Romans named their spa town, Aquae Sulis. The Cross Spring is now recognized as an official sacred site. As you relax in the oval Cross Bath, you can watch the natural thermal waters cascade from a specially commissioned poolside fountain. The Cross

Bath provides an opportunity to experience Bath's natural thermal waters in a very special setting.

As the Cross Bath is a historic, stand-alone building separate from the main spa, it does not have the facilities to offer spa treatments. We have this private Thermal pool for 1 ½ hours to soak away the aches and pains of walking. Here we will honour with ceremony the Goddess Sulis Minvera.

Next we have the options: to watch square performances, visit Sally Lunn's Bunns or The Mad Hatter's Tea Party Coffee Shop. Likely we will be too full to eat again.

Sally Lunn's Bunns:

Coffee and Sally Lunn's Bunns: Sally Lunn's is much more than a world-famous tea and eating house in the center of the wonderful city of Bath England. Their historic building is one of the oldest houses in Bath. Their kitchen museum shows the actual kitchen used by the legendary young Huguenot baker Sally Lunn in Georgian Bath to create the first Bath bunn – an authentic regional speciality now known the world over.



The Mad Hatter's Tea Party - Tea Shop

It is an Alice in Wonderland–inspired tea room at 5 Orange Grove, Bath BA1 1LP, directly behind Bath Abbey and only a very short walk from the Roman Baths. It serves coffee, tea, homemade cakes, cream teas, snacks, breakfast, lunch, and afternoon tea in whimsical Mad Hatter–style surroundings.



Return to coach park by 5:00 p.m. and depart the city of Bath at 5:00 p.m. Arrive in Glastonbury at 6:00 p.m. Riverside Coach Park Avon St., Bath, BA1 1XA

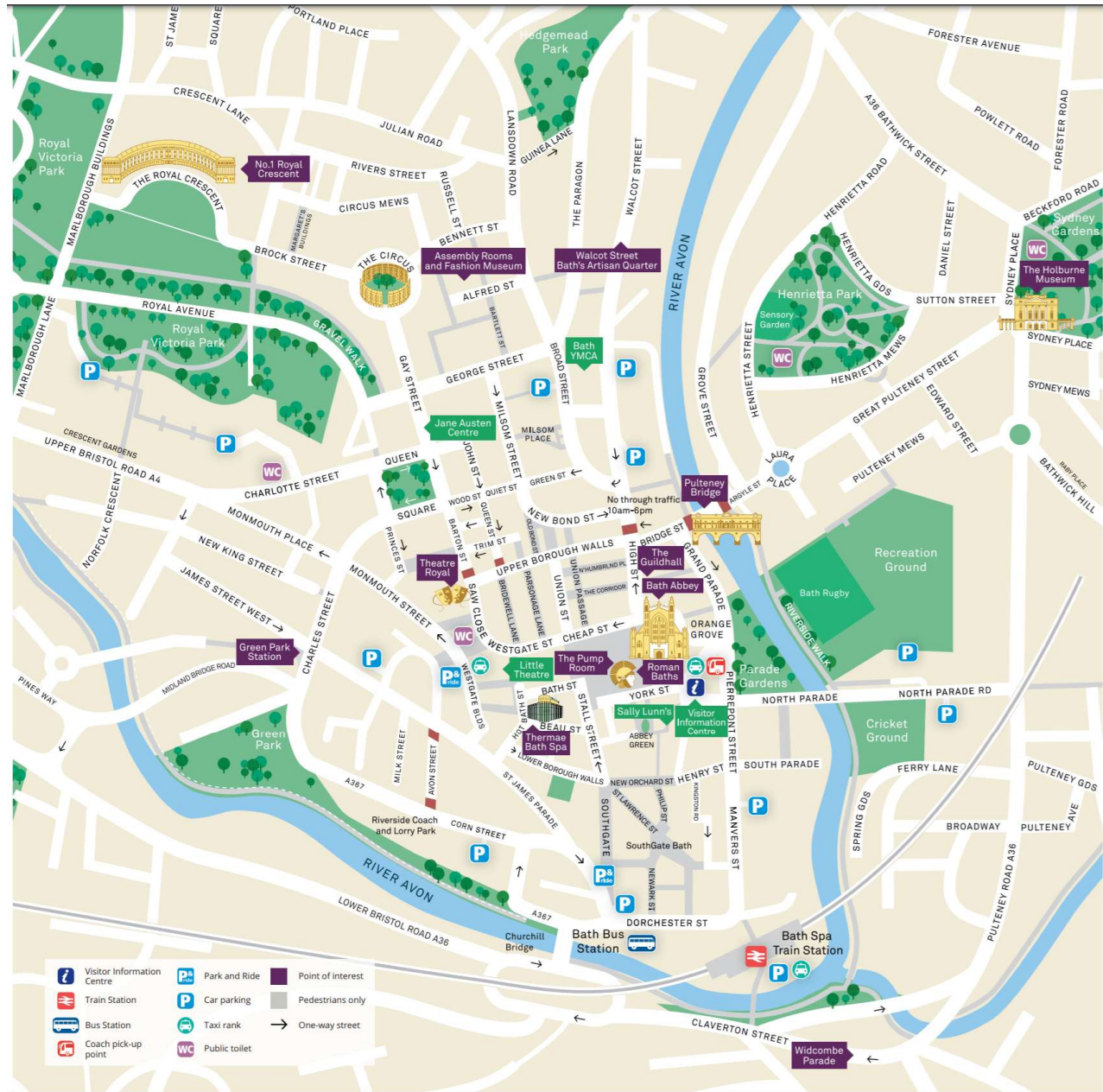

Map of the City of Bath

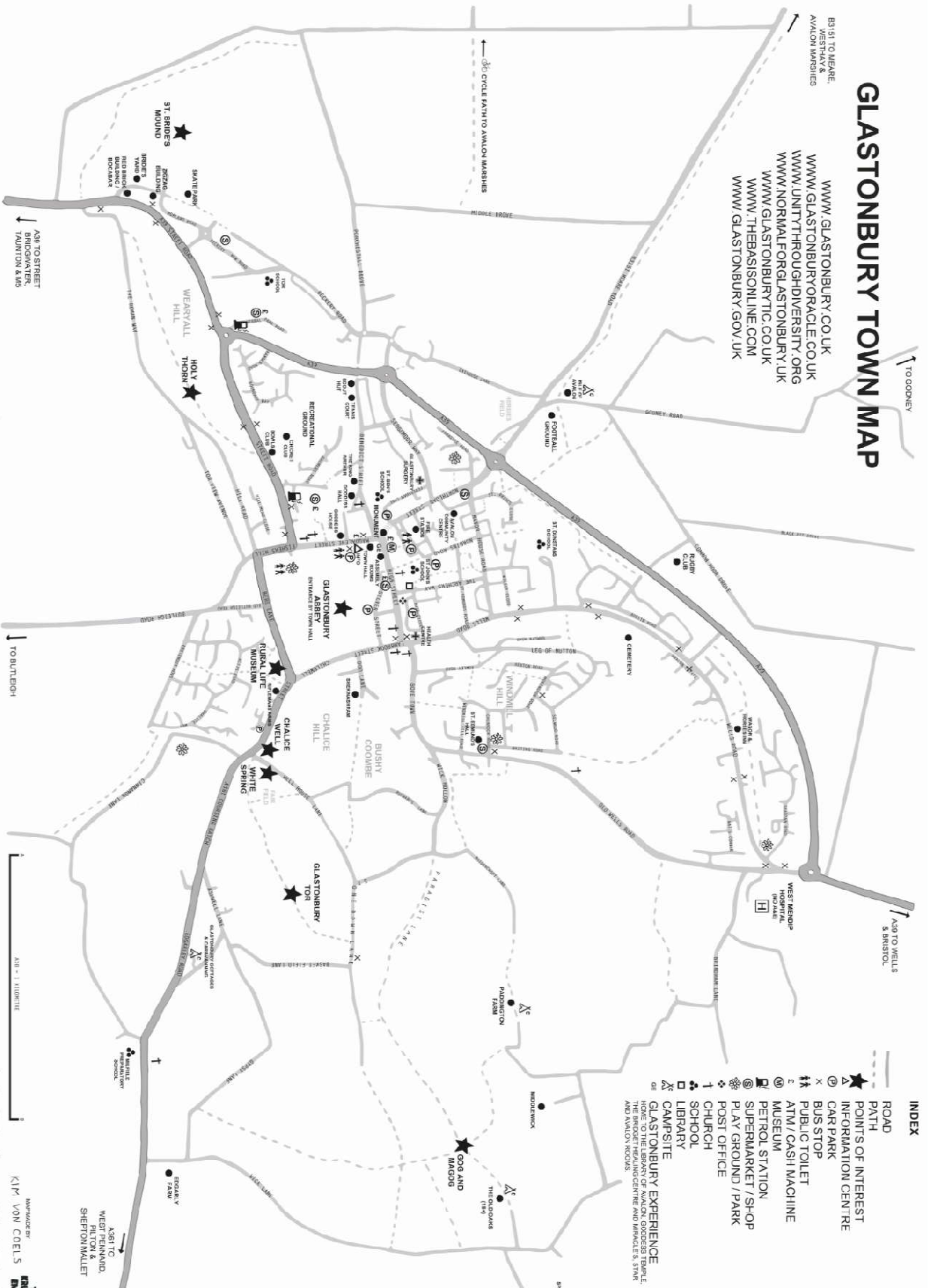
