

CHIEF'S REPORT

Two part-time Battalion Chiefs have been hired to complement the command staff.

Two CPR classes were conducted on September 9th. CPR certifications are needed to continue the excellent customer service provided by our support members. There was no charge for the classes.

Vehicle Inventory - Staff is working with Randy Campo on fleet related issues. We are currently evaluating what vehicles need to be sold, and what needs to be replaced. Further discussions are to be had, and we hope to have a report and plan by year's end.

PPE - Staff is in the process of going through our current inventory of PPE to obtain an accurate account of what has been purchased. Once established, we will attempt to submit documentation that may be retroactively apply R&R Grant funds. This will allow the District to place monies back into the general fund.

Training - Staff is compiling a list of instructors and curriculum that will provide training this winter. Training to possibly include Driver Operator 1A & 1B, Confine Space Awareness, and Hazardous Materials Training to be conducted at the station.

Reporting - Deficiencies have been identified in EMS reporting and NFIRS. Staff is working diligently to get this rectified. Accurate reporting and numbers in NFIRS are imperative for continued success in AFG, Safer, and 50/50 Grants. Grant providers use this data to assess needs.

Radios / Pagers - The District Mobile Radio and Paging products are in need of replacement. Our mobile radio support and parts availability ended on 01/2020. Priority will be made to our apparatus that will provide coverage for the District, Mutual Aid, and command vehicles.

October Bird Watch: A Feathered Fall Begins

The crisp air and golden light of early autumn made for a beautiful morning as birders gathered for the monthly Mosquito Bird Watch. With fall and winter hours now in effect, the walk begins promptly at 9:00 AM, offering a peaceful start to the day and a chance to witness the seasonal shift in our local avian population.

This month's walk was rich with sightings—some familiar favorites and a few special appearances. The group observed a total of 98 birds across 18 species, showcasing the diversity of habitats surrounding our community.

Whether you're a seasoned birder or just curious about the wildlife in our area, the monthly Bird Watch is a great way to connect with nature and neighbors alike.


47TH ANNUAL GOLD PAN OPEN
