SUMMER SAFETY & FIRE PREPAREDNESS

The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association (MVFA) encourages all residents to take a few simple steps to improve fire preparedness:

Defensible Space: Clear dry vegetation, trim trees, and create at least **100 feet of buffer** around your home.

Emergency Plans: Review evacuation routes and ensure your family knows what to do if a wildfire threatens the area.

Fire-Resistant Landscaping: Plant low-flammability species and keep mulch and debris away from structures.

Community Engagement: Participate in upcoming fire safety events, including **MFPD's Open House on June 14**, where valuable tips and materials will be provided.

Taking proactive steps now can help protect homes, neighbors, and our beautiful surroundings from wildfire threats. Stay alert, stay prepared, and let's work together to keep **Life on the Hill** safe!

CHIEF'S MESSAGE

Personnel:

We are pleased to announce the successful recruitment of Mark Foley as Fire Captain in April. He will soon be promoted to Battalion Chief. Mark brings extensive experience and skills to the role and will utilize his network to find financial and training opportunities. He is tasked with managing training and providing district command coverage when necessary. Additionally, Volunteer Firefighter Jack White has joined our ranks, bolstering our firefighter cadre with his considerable experience.

Operations:

One of my main goals since returning is to make this Fire District self-reliant and resilient. The Fire District must not rely on a single person for effective service delivery. We need an intrinsic command pool equipped to manage complex incidents and day-to-day operations. These leaders should manage emergency service requests, train, guide, and mentor our personnel in the absence of senior leaders. Building resilience within the Fire District ensures continuity of operations regardless of individual availability. Our personnel engage in critical thought processes to manage emergencies and elevate themselves professionally, making decisions that benefit the community.

Despite sustaining a severe injury—a compression fracture to my L-5 vertebrae—I remain in control of day-to-day operations, aided by Mark Foley's leadership in my absence. Through interoperation agreements with Garden Valley and Georgetown Fire, we maintain a coordinated response for incident command. Our training and preparation have enabled personnel to operate effectively in austere environments, managing emergency incidents while directing station operations.

Evacuation Drill:

The Mosquito Fire District is planning its annual evacuation drill and Open House on June 14, 2025. Informational checkpoints will be set up, and fliers regarding community evacuation will be distributed. After the drill, there will be an Open House serving hotdogs and drinks to residents. Community groups are welcome to set up informational or fundraising booths at the Fire Station during the event.

Please note that the Fire District does not have the authority to call for a community wide mandatory evacuation. This can only be done by the El Dorado County Sheriff's Department. However, the Fire District does have the authority and the responsibility to conduct focused evacuations based on a growing threat to life and property. This is a narrow evacuation based on fire activity, energy production, rate of spread and direction of travel. If the threat is imminent, life safety is always the priority. We will get ahead of the fire to notify residents that evacuation should occur for their life safety. We will document addresses notified, contact the El Dorado County Office of Emergency Services through the Camino Emergency Communications Center. Should the Sheriff's Department decide on a community wide evacuation, once notified, we will notify the community of a mandatory evacuation through house-to-house notifications until relieved by Law Enforcement, while continuing to provide real-time fire activity information to the Emergency Operations Center to facilitate informed decision-making.

Recruitment and Retention:

We aim to recruit a new Fire Chief by August 2026. It's crucial to change the perception that our department is a steppingstone department and focus on retaining members long-term due to the substantial cost of training and outfitting new members.

I will suggest to the Board of Directors we start recruiting for Fire Chief in June, as I plan to step down on August 1, 2026.

Since the Fire Chief is the subject matter expert for Emergency Service Operations, this office should manage the recruitment process (excluding selection, which is the board's purview). This involves establishing a hiring group including current Firefighters, Support Group members, and Board Members. The group will identify desired personal traits, while using State Fire Marshal standards for training and experience to establish minimum requirements. We will require candidates conduct a visit to the Fire District. A panel of county Fire Chiefs will review resumes and assess command abilities. The Recruitment Group will conduct interviews, evaluate candidates, and submit a ranked list to the Board of Directors for final interviews and hiring. This process will take approximately one year, allowing the selected Chief two months to prepare before taking over management of the Fire District starting August 1, 2026.

Recruitment and Retention:

We successfully recruited one new firefighter in April. Please welcome Jack White to the Fire District. Jack brings considerable EMS and fire experience.

Department Training and Safety:

We will publish a training calendar for upcoming district training and opportunities available to all Fire/Support Group Personnel.

Logistics:

We received a donation of used BK Radios from the JPA.

Interlocal:

CALFIRE will suspend all burn permits on June 2nd. Discussions were held with County Supervisor Lori Parlin, CAO Sue Henneke, and LAFFCO MSR Committee regarding the financial sustainability of this Fire District due to the impact of ending Aid to Fire Funding in 2017. Although no promises were made, Supervisor Parlin understands the financial impacts. Less than 1% of the County's overall \$400,000,000 budget would fully fund all rural fire districts to ensure community safety.

Chief Brown's Report:

Chief Brown completed his report and made recommendations to our Board of Directors. The report is available for review. Payments to Georgetown Fire for this study have not been fully

completed; initially costing \$9,000 for three months, extended by another month increasing the total to \$12,000. We owe Georgetown Fire \$6,000.

Legislative:

Grants: Our 50/50 CALFIRE Grant has been submitted.

Apparatus:

In early May, the Bureau of Automotive Repair notified us that recently acquired vehicles were not compliant with smog testing regulations. Vehicles obtained post-January 1, 2017, require smog tests and certification. Two passed, three failed, and the Support Group Vehicle needs a retest.

Stretchfab Fabrication independently evaluated these vehicles in January, confirming their mechanical soundness. However, the evaluation did not include smog testing. The 2002 Explorer was deemed irreparable and removed from inventory. Due to the age of our Fire Apparatus, obtaining parts for repairs has caused delays. Estimated repair costs are:

Engine 75: \$21,000

Engine 275: \$15,000

Expedition 7500: \$3,300 for recent mechanical failure

The Support Group Utility vehicle underwent service and is expected to pass smog now. Other vehicles will undergo review. If repair costs exceed vehicle value, they may be surplused. This issue persists due to acquiring high-mileage light-duty vehicles regularly.

REMS/Line EMT-Medic:

Technical Rescue Equipment is arriving, and we will commence full in-service training to establish a REMS Team. Discussions with El Dorado Emergency Services Authority (JPA) aim to provide EMT training in-district for Firefighters and Support Group Members, targeting a start date in October.

Public Safety and Training:

Please clean your property and be prepared for emergencies and evacuations. Digitize important documents such as bank accounts, insurance policies, birth certificates, and medical records. Scan and store them on portable electronic devices.

Support Group Training:

Monthly training is scheduled for the first Saturday of each month.

Community Events:

DA'x hosted a successful Raise the Roof Gala, and is still taking donations for the replacement of the Fire Station roof.

MVFA will hold a Yard Sale Event on June 7, and Spaghetti Dinner on June 21.

SUPPORT GROUP EVACUATION DRILL - SATURDAY, JUNE 14, 2025

Heads Up! On Saturday, June 14, 2025, the Support Group teams will be out in full force for their annual evacuation training. This critical drill ensures readiness and familiarity with procedures, should an emergency arise.

From **9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.**, trained teams in yellow shirts will be stationed at two checkpoints to practice road control and radio communication. If you're traveling during that time, you may see personnel holding **STOP/SLOW** signs—they're conducting a drill and sharing important safety information. Look for cones and signage marking their locations.

This exercise helps strengthen the community's preparedness for safe evacuation and reinforces the importance of clear communication during emergencies.

Since only a small percentage of the community will be aware of the Road Control activity, there is a fun event after the conclusion of the Road Control Drill at 11:00 a.m. open to everyone.

BIRDING AT FINNON LAKE

Birdwatchers at Finnon Lake Reservoir were treated to an impressive display of avian activity this past month, spotting a diverse mix of raptors, woodpeckers, and songbirds thriving in the local habitat.

Among the highlights was the majestic **Bald Eagle**, soaring high above the lake, its commanding presence a true symbol of wilderness. Also seen was the **Cooper's Hawk**, a swift and skilled hunter patrolling the treetops in search of prey.

Woodpeckers made their presence known, with the vibrant **Acorn Woodpecker** energetically storing acorns in tree cavities—a fascinating behavior unique to the species. Meanwhile, keen observers noted a **Black Phoebe** catching insects with precision.

Further enriching the variety of sightings were the ever-watchful **California Scrub-Jay**, known for its striking blue plumage and intelligent nature.
