## 2016 Defensible Space Inspections

CAL FIRE Defensible Space inspectors will make the majority of their inspections in the months leading up to fire season in order to allow landowners time and flexibility to prepare their property for the upcoming fire season. CAL FIRE inspectors will attempt to inspect all the homes they have access to (e.g., no locked gates, can be viewed from a public place/roadway, or property that can be accessed by any private citizen, mailperson, delivery person, etc.) within a given target area prior to moving onto another area. The inspectors will be conducting their inspections during reasonable daylight hours, knocking on the door of the residence and being professionally dressed so that CAL FIRE staff can easily be identified as fire department personnel. Ideally, CAL FIRE would meet all landowners on-site so that questions can be answered and hazardous conditions addressed. If the Defensible Space inspectors are not able to meet face to face with the landowners, a "Notice of Fire Hazard Inspection" form will be left at the property. The "Notice of Fire Hazard Inspection" form will give a detailed description of what was inspected and if any corrections are needed to improve the property for fire survival. A phone number will be provided to the landowner to use in the event they have questions concerning the inspection or what/why hazards need to be reduced.



Defensible Space inspections are supported by the State Responsibility Area (SRA) Fire Prevention fee, which is an annual fee assessed to rural residents for fire prevention activities in the SRA. The Fire Prevention Fee resulted from a law signed by Governor Brown in 2011 which imposed a fee to owners of habitable structures in the SRA.

## **SCPOA**

The new SCPOA Board of Directors (BOD) had its first open session on March 17<sup>th</sup>. After we managed to clear the firehouse of a couple of firetrucks, the meeting was under way. We had a full BOD quorum and about thirty-five members attended. This is the second time I've had the privilege to serve the community. I was encouraged by the interests you expressed. There were diverse opinions and great questions focused on our community affairs and its welfare. Some of you posed questions to which I (or the Board) did not have immediate answers, or you wished to extend your comments for a longer time period. I promised to address these questions ASAP. Subsequently, I've already spoken with some of you. This has given me valuable feedback which will allow me to serve you better.

There were also some questions as to how your BOD can best serve the Homeowners Association (HOA). This may not have been clearly addressed in the agenda, so I offer this: An elected person of a public or private BOD has a fiduciary duty to all voters or members. A public organization, such as a School Board, is governed by very strict and often inflexible laws and policies. Fortunately, our HOA is a private corporation governed by its By-Laws and the Davis Sterling Act. This allows us greater flexibility in the way we conduct business.

The BOD has certain discretion in its decisions and actions. For example, just as a private corporation such as General Motors BOD determines how a meeting is conducted and who may be invited, so does our private HOA BOD decide how to conduct our meetings. This BOD has decided that in addition to considering the comments from the members attending, it will also take into account the interests of the hundreds of community members not attending.

Your input guides the Board and is always welcome. I encourage anyone with any SCPOA comments or questions to speak with me directly.

## **Finnon Lake Recreation Area**

MVFA Board of Directors is continuing to find ways to pay the costs of keeping the park operating and improving. MVFA receives no money from any tax source or from the Swansboro Country Property Owners Association. We are totally self-supporting. MVFA offers an annual Day Use Pass for

Mosquito residents for activities like swimming, fishing, boating and disc golf. Contact Dave Angelo (530-621-3688) to purchase the new 2016 Day Use Pass. Hiking, bird watching, and bicycling at Finnon are free of charge. Every cent collected from park fees and donations goes back into improving the site. The MVFA budget is public information. The budget is discussed, and copies are available at every board meeting. MVFA has no paid employees; everyone who gives their time is a volunteer.

MVFA moved its annual community picnic back to Finnon Lake, plus additional events like the Easter Egg Hunt and Halloween Trunk or Treat now take place at Finnon Lake. Mosquito residents are encouraged to consider Finnon Lake when planning family events, church outings, or club campouts. There were two weddings at Finnon Lake in 2015, with more to come. Now that the dam road and bridge are complete, the park is open all year. Finnon Lake Recreation Area progress has come a long way since our dam was condemned a number of years ago when the decision was made to reconstruct it. Most of the costs of the Dam Reconstruction Project were paid by grants from private conservation organizations and state grants set aside for wildlife and wetland preservation. With the dam project complete, MVFA must comply with the requirements of these grants. These requirements primarily call for fish and wildlife monitoring to ensure the health of the habitat for years to come. Recently, it appeared that a mating pair of Bald Eagles may consider making Finnon Lake home. A wet winter and spring have helped the habitat immensely.

Other projects and maintenance work will continue at Finnon Lake under the MVFA Campground and Property committee as well as the newly formed Fish and Wildlife committee chaired by Dave Angelo. Future projects include improvements to the campground bathrooms, continued development of the beach/swim area, and improvements to the cafe gardens and pavilion area. We will continue to have our annual Campground Cleanup day later in the spring. Volunteers are always welcome. Thanks to Jan Okumura and friends for their recent volunteer work and contributions to the cafe gardens. We also appreciate the more than 30 volunteers who have helped improve and maintain the park over the years. ## **Red Cross Partnership**

Did you know that if a fire starts in your home, you may have just two minutes to escape? The most effective way to protect yourself and your home from fire is to identify and remove fire hazards. 60 percent of house fire deaths occur in homes with no working smoke alarms. During a home fire, working smoke alarms and a fire escape plan that has been practiced regularly can save lives.

The MVFA is proud to be partnering with the American Red Cross for the National Home Fire Campaign. This education only takes about 15 minutes of the resident's time.

This campaign focuses on volunteers visiting homes in our Mosquito/Swansboro area to:

- Installing new smoke alarms
- Replace alarm batteries
- Educate residents on fire and local hazard safety and
- Make home fire escape plans.



Home fires kill more people in an average year than every domestic natural disaster combined. The goal of this campaign is to reduce home fire deaths and injuries by 25% by the end of 2019.

Every bedroom and every level of the house needs to have a smoke alarm. This will be a FREE event in May 2016 for anybody who is in need of replacing old smoke detectors or having new smoke detectors installed. We need your help to identify the need here on the hill so that we'll be prepared.

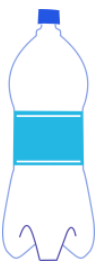

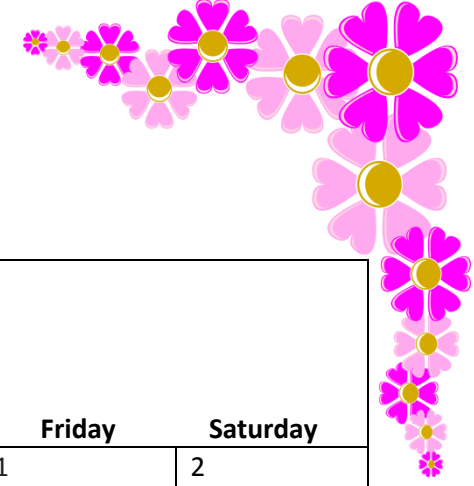
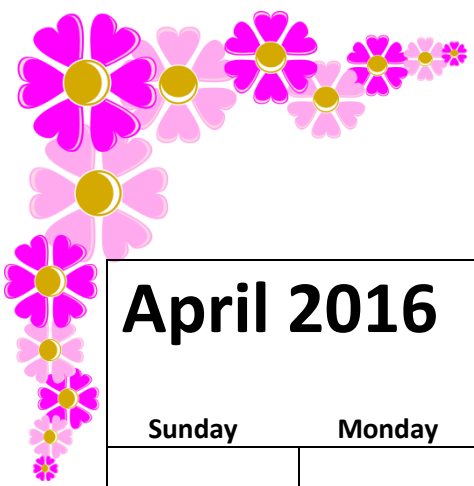
