The Mosquito Fire Protection District has three cadets attending the Divide Academy hosted by Garden Valley and Georgetown Fire. Our district participated in a live fire training in the burn building at Georgetown Station 62 on Saturday March 16th. The cadets have been training on pulling charged hose lines, throwing ladders, forcible entry, ventilation and rescue operations.



The academy ends in mid-May, after completion of wildland fire training, and we look forward to pinning three new district firefighters this spring.

SCPOA Report

The new treasurer, David Blain, has been reviewing accounts and noted over \$300,000 in a basic checking account, and he will be researching alternatives to earn interest on these funds. He noted that last year the budget was over by \$71,000 with three areas as main

causes, legal, bad debt and contingency fund. He questioned whether amounts budgeted for this year were adequate and was advised they should be fine. Some of the legal fees should be paid back and there shouldn't be any large bad debt write offs. The playground was the reason the contingency fund overspending. He also wants to have comparisons of several year's budgets to see trends, develop guidelines for future treasurers and standards for authorization of the management company when writing checks for non-routine expenditures.

The bylaw committee has completed an updated set with corrections for the board to review.

The El Dorado Conservation District has been chosen to manage the fire safe grant that was recently received. Mark Egbert, who was very involved in the Finnon Dam Project, will be the manager assigned. Forms are being developed to allow homeowners to account for their time working on their own property. This time will be able to be counted as "in kind" work required for the grant. Jerry will be the SCPOA representative to the fire safe council for the grant project. The fire safe council has also funded the chipping program again this year which allows homeowners to have their brush chipped at no charge. An update was given on the Department of Transportation (DOT) report and requirements for the airport. Tom Best has been in communication with DOT and will be working with them as well as homeowners to bring needed items into compliance. SCPOA will need to repaint some markings on the runway to comply.

The common area committee will meet to discuss lake treatment, as well as determine how low the water level in Dyer Lake should be before adding water. The plan is to use the well to keep water levels up and a larger pump could be purchased if the current one cannot keep up.

The board voted to change the time, day and location of future board meetings. The will now be held the 3rd Saturday at 10:00 AM in the maintenance shed.

A brief discussion was held about purchasing a snow plow for just under \$4000, no decision was made.

A discussion was held as to whether SCPOA should make the annual donation to the fire station of \$2400. Since the item was budgeted, it will be made.

Next SCPOA meeting will be the third Saturday, April 20th, at the maintenance shed at 10:00 AM

- 1 Golden Delicious apple, cubed
- 1 Gala apple, cubed
- 1 Bosc pear, cubed

3 ribs celery, chopped 3/4 cup sweetened dried cranberries

1/2 cup chopped walnuts

1/4 cup chopped pecans

1 cup sour cream

3/4 cup mayonnaise

1 tablespoon granulated cane sugar

2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice (optional)

Directions

Combine apples, pear, celery, cranberries, walnuts, and pecans in a large bowl.

Whisk sour cream, mayonnaise, sugar and lemon juice together in a separate bowl for the dressing. Pour dressing into apple mixture; toss until evenly coated. Chill in refrigerator for at least 15 minutes before serving.
