Fire and Fall Injury Prevention in the Home

Each year, more than 1.6 million older Americans go to the emergency room for fall-related injuries. Among older adults, falls are the number one cause of fractures, and hospital admissions for trauma, loss of independence, and injury related deaths. Cooking is the leading cause of fire related injuries and the leading cause of fire related death is smoking.

Americans age 65 and older are 2.5 times more likely to die in fires and as Americans age, their fire risk increases. Contributing factors to fires and falls include medications, hearing/vision loss, loss of strength, balance, and mobility. It is possible to reduce your risk by reviewing these tips and changing or modifying your behavior, habits, and environment.

Fire Prevention Tips

- Never leave stovetop cooking unattended.
- Wear tight, short, or rolled up sleeves while cooking rather than loose or dangling clothing.
- Use oven mitts or potholders and never use a dishtowel as a potholder.
- If a pan catches fire, slide a lid over it, turn off the burner and call 9-1-1.
- In case of an oven or microwave fire, turn off the oven or microwave. Do not open the door, and call 9-1-1.
- Do not cook if you are drowsy from medication. Plan meals around your medications.
- Keep clutter and combustibles away from your stove.
- If your clothes catch fire, STOP, DROP, and ROLL, or smother the flames with a towel or a blanket.
- Test smoke alarms monthly, replace batteries at least once a year and replace smoke alarms every 10 years.

Fall Prevention Tips

- Clear the way, keeping stairs and walking areas free of electrical and phone cords, shoes, clothing, books, magazines, and other clutter.
- Improve lighting in your home by using night-lights on the path between the bedroom and bathroom. Turn on the lights before using the stairs.
- Use non-slip mats in the bathtub and shower and install grab bars on the wall next to the bathtub, shower, and toilet.
- Use only throw rugs with rubber, non-skid backing. Always smooth out wrinkles and folds in carpeting and rugs.

The Mosquito FPD is willing to assist you with battery installation.

FINNON LAKE RECREATION AREA

Finnon Lake Recreation Area is owned and maintained by MVFA and is open year-round for camping, fishing, boating, swimming, picnicking and disc golf. The MVFA Board of Directors is responsible for finding ways to pay the costs of keeping Finnon Lake Recreation Area (FLRA) operating safely and always improving. The MVFA Board is responsible for payments of more than \$10,000 in annual bills (dam fees, insurance, taxes and maintenance costs) to keep the park open to the public. Finnon Lake is a valuable community asset with potential for both recreation and fire abatement. Neither Finnon Lake nor MVFA is part of the Mosquito Fire Department (MFPD) and receives no money from MFPD or any other tax source. Neither Finnon Lake nor MVFA is a part of Swansboro Property Owners Association (SCPOA) and receives no money from them. MVFA is totally self-supported by park fees, rents, donations and fund-raiser events. All adult residents in good standing of the Mosquito Fire Protection District are automatically members of MVFA.

The \$6.00 Day Use fee for day use activities - swimming, fishing, boating (including inflatables), picnicking and disc golf - is collected on the honor system. Hiking, walking, bird watching and bicycling at Finnon

are free of charge. Every dollar collected from park fees and donations goes to paying bills and improving the site. The café is leased to a concessionaire who has full responsibility for its operation and upkeep. MVFA has no paid employees. Everyone who gives their time to help with park maintenance, improvements, websites and reservations, Mosquito Byte, Mosquito Phone Book, events and other projects, is a volunteer. To enhance your membership in MVFA, become a volunteer. MVFA offers an annual Day Use Pass for Mosquito Fire District residents. Contact Dave Angelo at (530)621-3688 to purchase the Resident Day Use Pass.

Thanks to the many volunteer members of the Hangtown Disc Golf Club who came up to Finnon Lake to do the work of maintaining the course over the past few weekends and to Marc Angelo for organizing the work parties at this critical time of year for course maintenance.. An Abridged History of MVFA

No history of MVFA is complete without beginning with Lois Pearson. Lois was one of the primary individuals involved in the founding of the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department (MVFD) in 1972. Lois's historical recollections of Mosquito can be found at www.adamsamigos.net.

The current Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD), was formed by voter initiative in 1978 and is an entity supported by property taxes from district property owners. The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department continued to operate side-by-side in support of MFPD. All of MVFD's revenue came from donations, Finnon Lake and fund raising events.

Prior to 1997 the State of California owned the Finnon Lake property. In 1997, the Finnon dam was declared seismically unsafe. The MVFD bought the property for \$1.00 with restrictions that it had to be maintained for PUBLIC recreation and that if MVFA ever decided to sell the property, the state would get first right of refusal to repurchase it for \$1.00. State officials promised to waive most of the fees associated with maintaining a dam of this size, primarily yearly inspections by the Department of Water Resources, until the dam was replaced in 2011. Unfortunately, state personnel changed and as the economy got worse, the promise to forgive the yearly dam fees was soon forgotten. MVFD accumulated a large debt for unpaid inspection fees.

During the period of time MVFD believed that the dam fees were going to be waived, it was able to make significant contributions to the MFPD for equipment, facility maintenance and fire fighter recognition functions through the fundraisers and events originated by Lois Pearson.

In July 2005, MVFD reorganized from a 501(c)(4) to a 501(c)(3) non-profit community support organization. In late 2006, the name of MVFD was changed to MVFA (Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association). Every adult residing in the Mosquito Fire Protection District is automatically a member of MVFA.

On April 17, 2007 the Finnon Lake property deed was officially signed over to MVFA. At that time, the attorney for MFPD *advised against any financial connection between MFPD and MVFA* in order to avoid any taxpayer liability connected with the Finnon property, including dam fees, property taxes, liability insurance and maintenance costs. The MFPD board soon dropped MVFA from its liability insurance coverage, and MVFA purchased its own policy. At the same time, MVFA was informed of a large liability for past dam inspection fees by the State of California and for many years was forced to direct a large portion of Finnon Lake Recreation Area income and contributions from community members towards that debt, finally reaching the end of this obligation within the last few years.

The financial and legal separation between MFPD and MVFA does not stop MVFA from contributing to and volunteering for work to support the fire department. Projects such as replacing old drywall, constructing the brick fascia, remodeling the office space and bathrooms and replacing the window blinds at the station were needs that were not covered in the MFPD budget and were accomplished with donations and help from MVFA volunteers. Recently, MVFA sponsored a fund drive to purchase a Thermal Imaging Camera for the fire department. The mission of MVFA is to provide support for both the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department and support to the Mosquito community as a whole in the form of a food pantry, emergency financial aid, community activities, newsletter, and phone book.
