The California Forest Stewardship Helpline

The California Forest Stewardship Helpline (1-800-738-8733) has been in service for several years. It provides a point of contact for people who have questions and/or concerns about California's forests and forest management. A Registered





Professional Forester under contract to the Northern California Society of American Foresters (NorCal SAF) has staffed it. Grants from the U.S. Forest Service, State, and Private Forestry support the Helpline. CAL FIRE's Forest Stewardship Program has been instrumental in encouraging its use.

With the current and expected long-term catastrophic tree mortality in the Sierra Nevada and elsewhere, there is now a need for more public outreach and education on California's forests than ever before. The Helpline is an asset that can be used to meet the demand for information on tree mortality and other issues. Dr. Richard Harris, former UC Cooperative Extension Forestry Specialist, Registered Professional Forester and contractor to NorCal SAF, will respond to calls and e-mails and provide information on tree mortality and referrals to service providers and entities that are addressing this issue in El Dorado County. Calls will be answered Monday-Friday between 10 a.m.- 2 p.m. or 6 p.m.- 8 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m.- 2 p.m. Voice mail messages will be returned as soon as possible. The Helpline is not used to promote any commercial interests. In cases where a caller wants a referral to professional services, they will be provided with a standard list of providers, such as a list of Registered Professional Foresters or arborists that work in their geographic area. All inquiries will be considered confidential to avoid any potential invasion of privacy. Selected callers may be requested to provide personal information so that follow-up monitoring on the effectiveness of the Helpline can be conducted. SCPOA - Enjoy Your Common Areas

We are experiencing an unusually mild and pleasant summer. Our common areas are in great shape thanks to Kevin and Jonathan of our maintenance crew, Dustin Sears, Jerry Pullin, Kari Guthrie, Mari Miller, and Robert Keel of the common area committee. Also thanks to Kim Purcell, our airport liaison, and all the volunteers of the Pilots' Association, for the runway a well maintained runway. And of course, thanks to Mother Nature, our parks are greener, our ponds and lakes have topped off and we have an excellent opportunity to enjoy the outdoors.

According to article I of our DCRs, "Common areas" shall mean and refer to those areas of land shown on any recorded subdivision map of the properties and intended to be devoted to the common use and enjoyment of the owners of the properties. The key words are "use and enjoyment" for all SCPOA property owners. The common areas include our lakes, airport, parks and other designated areas. Interestingly, our roads are county owned, SCPOA maintained, but are not common areas. Furthermore, Article IV provides that every member shall have a right and easement of enjoyment in and to the common areas, and such easements shall be appurtenant to and shall pass with the title to every lot or plot. Guests should be accompanied by the property owner friend for any activities in the common areas.

Our common areas are accessible on a first come basis. This means that if you wish to schedule an event such as a family get together, fly-in, or social gathering which may stress the capacity of the common area you plan to use, it is a good idea to let the SCPOA board know ahead of time so some arrangements can be made to accommodate you. Call Judy Reule, your association manager at Management Trust (916-985-3633 x 151), and she will put you in contact with the appropriate board director liaison.

Enjoy your common areas but remember, it is your common area. The association develops and maintains it, but ultimately you pay for this through assessments on your property. Advise your guests to keep the area neat, collect your garbage, and respect the facilities. Pets must be kept under control and their waste properly disposed. Consider safety. There are no life guards on duty. Children should be supervised by an adult. Motor vehicles are only allowed on the parking areas. If your guests are flying in, it is your responsibility to brief them on local conditions. When in doubt, use your common sense. Leave the area in as good or better shape as you found it so the next person can enjoy it also. Enjoy your summer!
