## Chief's Corner

### **The Holidays are here!**

Again, another year is approaching an end. We want to wish you all the very best. There is much that we will be discussing in the new year, especially about where the fire district is going or not. But, for now, we will be focusing on you, the community, the holidays and what we at the fire district can do to serve you better.



On **Friday, December 7<sup>th</sup> at 7pm**, we will be holding the Third Annual Christmas Tree Lighting. This is a gift to the community from the firefighters. It is a way for us to express to all of you our gratitude for your support given throughout the year. Come early at 6pm, as there will be arts and crafts, ornament decorating, and time for the community to trim the tree. We will have warm beverages including hot chocolate. We invite you all to bring your favorite Christmas snack to share with others. We will have Christmas music playing. Once the tree has been trimmed, we will select a lucky elf to throw the switch. We want to make the tree as bright as possible, so Santa will see it from his sleigh.

When you go to set up your own decorations at home please remember some simple safety tips.

- 1) Check the wires. Any strand that has exposed wire, please replace them. If you accidentally put a staple through a strand, remove the staple and wrap with electrical tape, ensure that it is weather tight. If your light strand is 3 to 5 years old, consider replacing it. Most manufacturers' recommendations state that these types of lights are temporary and should be taken down or replaced after 90 days of use.
- 2) If you use a pre-lit tree, read the Manufacturers recommendation for use. Inspect all the connections for corrosion and damage. Also, please keep young critters away from electrical cords. Our little fury friends like to chew on the cords.
- 3) If you use a real tree to celebrate the season, please make sure it is fresh, and watered well. When you first get your tree, pull on the branches. Count the needles that fall off in your hand. Repeat this weekly. If your tree starts to release more it is an indicator that it is drying out.
- 4) LED Lights vs Incandescent. LED lights are much safer, they use considerably less electricity and produce very little heat. If you use incandescent lights on a real tree watch for browning of needles around the lights. This is an indicator that the needles around the bulb are drying out and can ignite. Keep paper wrapped presents away from hot bulbs or other ignition sources.

For me, personally, this time of year is a way to focus on why we celebrate Christmas. Thousands of years ago a wonderful gift given to the world. To Christians, the Christmas season represents that gift. To other faiths, this time of year represents a promise given and kept by God in the Celebration of Lights, or Hanukah. To others, it represents a time of perpetual hope. A time where people of the world focus on the needs of others.

This Thanksgiving means so much to us at the fire station. We have had personnel on the fire lines all season long. During an eight-week period this fire season, we lost a firefighter a week in the state of California. Our firefighters took part in saving a community so very much like Mosquito. While deployed on the Carr fire, our firefighters took part in a heroic stand to protect the community of French Gulf. We had personnel on the frontlines during the destruction of the town of Paradise. Our personnel took part in rescue, evacuation and initial recovery operations during the height of the fire and then deployed as fire line medics. Though we truly appreciate the chance to serve our state, we are grateful to have a chance represent this community with great pride and distinction.

Most of all, we are grateful that all our personnel returned to us unscathed. I thank God every day for these young men and women. This Thanksgiving Day, I thanked God for his watching over them and focus on the reason for the season. We will stand for firefighters lost, for law enforcement and our military. We kneel in gratitude, contemplation and prayer. Our prayers for all of you, is for a joyous, safe holiday season.

Because of its history, MVFA has always had strong ties to the Mosquito Fire Department. Former chiefs and fire fighters have been members of the MVFA Board of Directors. MVFA By-laws have ALWAYS specified giving fire fighter personnel top priority in the nomination process for membership on the MVFA Board of Directors. At present, five of the eight MVFA officers and directors are card-carrying members of the Mosquito Fire Protection District. After the election, this number will increase to six.

## **December's Recipe: Smashed Apples and Sweet Potatoes**

Here is a healthy take on a seasonal favorite. It's also gluten-free.

Prep 10 m Cook 30 m Ready in 40 m *Recipe By: ELFINDANCER*

"This is a super simple recipe that I make as a sweet, easy side dish. It tastes a LOT like apple pie... but even healthier!"

### **Ingredients**

2 large sweet potatoes, peeled and diced  
2 tablespoons butter  
1/4 cup white sugar  
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon ground allspice  
1 Granny Smith apple - peeled, cored and sliced  
1/8 cup milk

### **Directions**

Place the sweet potato in a medium saucepan and fill with enough water to cover the potatoes. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to medium, and simmer for about 20 minutes or until tender. Remove from heat, drain and set aside.

Melt butter over low heat in a small saucepan. Mix in the sugar, cinnamon and allspice. Add the apple slices, cover, and let simmer for 5 minutes, or until the apples are tender.

Mix the apple mixture into the drained sweet potatoes along with the milk. Mix well using an electric mixer or just a fork until potatoes are mashed.
