Chief's Report

As Fire Season 2020 winds down, there is still a serious threat to our community. This season will not be over until there is significant rain. Destructive fires have occurred which homes were lost, followed by rain a day or two later (Oakland Fire 10/19/91). We remember the Camp Fire which destroyed the town of Paradise on Thursday November 8, 2018 at 5:33am. The fire was the most expensive natural disaster in the world that year, in



terms of insured losses. 86 people were killed, 19,000 buildings destroyed. A study claimed that 50 more deaths were attributed to the fire, indirectly. It is important that we remain vigilant and for residents to continue to be fire safe, including being packed up prepared to quickly leave. Check the District's web site for further information on preparedness and evacuation planning. Hopefully rain will come soon and put an end to this fire season.

I am pleased to announce that the Mosquito Fire District will receive a brand new Type 6 engine, as we requested in July. This is the first OES Type 6 engine in El Dorado County and a landmark accomplishment for our District.



On Tuesday 10/25 we experienced our third Public Safety Power Shutdown (PSPS). Fortunately, the predicted winds did not materialize (they did reach over 100 mph in some places). Because of dire predictions for historic winds, we prepared for the worst. AT&T provided generators to retain phone service, but a generator failed at Mosquito & Rock Creek Rds. (9/26 AM), causing the phones at the Fire Station to go down. Service was restored several hours later. The power was restored in the afternoon Thursday 10/27. Thank you to the Support Group and Staff for preparing and being ready. We are proud of our people who stand ready to protect and serve this community, despite any adverse conditions.

We participated in the Harvest Day event at Finnon Lake on 10/17 (at my request for volunteer recruitment). Apparatus and personnel were present to meet the public, discuss fire safety issues, offer demonstrations and safety tips, recruit new volunteers for support and firefighting. We were able to speak to several people who were interested in participating in emergency response volunteering and several others interested in the Support Group.

The Support Group is always excellent, strongly assisting us with responses and other projects. As stated previously the Group staffed the fire station and provided community assistance for three recent PSPS power shutdowns. The Group played an important role with two recent medical emergencies, which required helicopter landing assistance and transport of the flight medics to the patient. The Group's annual recognition luncheon scheduled for Saturday November 7, has been postponed due to weather and Covid restrictions.

We would like to cultivate more interest in the Support Group program from interested members of the community with specialized training and capabilities (medical, IT, web site

design, heavy equipment, mechanic, tree removal, etc). With our SAFER Grant marketing for volunteer firefighters we will also incorporate Support Group recruitment into our outreach.

After a very busy year at the campground we're planning to do some much needed maintenance to the bathrooms and campsites over the winter months. The bathrooms will be closed for toilet replacement as well as other maintenance items. We'll be planning some work parties to do trimming and burning of brush and trees, the disc golf groups will also be doing cleanup projects along the course.

A backup generator has been installed at Franks to make life easier during power outages, this is the old backup generator from the fire station that the department offered to MVFA for purchase.

MVFA will be having its board elections at our December meeting, we're always looking for volunteers to join the board or just help out with projects and Finnon cleanup days. The Finnon property is such a huge asset to our community as a recreation area as well as to fire protection and without volunteers we have no way to manage it.

SCPOA REPORT

Treasurer, David Blain, reported that he's finally getting up to date financial reports from the management company. There is still a surplus of \$42,000 YTD and projects a return to members of approximately \$140. David is suggesting a budget that has dues at \$550 which allows for \$105,000 to reserves and the return of the \$140, the budget will be finalized at the next meeting

Kevin reported that he has removed 16 trees from Bass Lake and 4 which were dying behind the maintenance shed, there are another 16 dying that PG&E will need to remove. There are

still chips available and 16 loads were delivered to members. The fall roadside spraying occurred, only 3 properties had no spray signs out.

The airport committee met to discuss the status of ongoing safety improvements. Runway markings are done, some tree clearing done and center points at each end of the runway will need to be surveyed. Still have a problem with one individual feeding the wildlife causing hazards as deer and turkey run across the runway for food. To increase safety during low light times such as morning, evening and cloudy days it was proposed to install a solar pilot controlled light system. This would improve safety by allowing better visibility of animals on runway and gives a lighted approach and safer environment for life flight helicopters at night. Considering the recent incident of an aircraft impacting turkeys on the runway it would be an economical proactive approach to safety.

The board approved an amendment to the bylaws in order to comply with new election rules. The board also approved the appointment of Barb Mikel as the inspection of elections. She volunteered for the position which saves the association almost \$3000 by not having to hire an independent inspector.

The issue of dogs off leash and non-members at Dyer was briefly discussed. Signs state dogs must be on leash.

Some content on the website was questioned and it was reiterated that items need to be approved by the board prior to posting.

Recipe of the Month Christmas Tacos

Slow Cooker Recipe or you can use your instant pot if you desire.

Ingredients:

- For the Short Ribs:
- 2 bone-in short ribs (about 2 1/2 pounds)
- Kosher salt
- 2 teaspoons oil
- 1 cup pomegranate juice
- 2 Ancho Chiles (stem and seeds removed)
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 1 bay leaf

- For the Pomegranate Pico:
- 1 cup pomegranate seeds
- 1 jalapeno pepper (small dice)
- 2 tablespoons shallot (small dice)
- 1 large lime (juiced)
- 1/4 cup pepitas (lightly toasted)
- •
- For Serving:
- 12 corn tortillas
- Garnish: Fresh cilantro, lime wedges, cotija cheese, or Mexican crema

Instructions:

- 1. Gather the ingredients.
- 2. Heat a cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat. Season the short ribs with kosher salt and add them to the pan. Brown for approximately 5 minutes per side, undisturbed to develop a nice crust. Some fat will render from the meat and aid in browning.
- 3. When the meat is well-browned remove from the pan and turn off the heat. Deglaze the pan with the pomegranate juice, scraping the bottom of the pan.
- 4. Place the meat and juice in a slow cooker set to low. Add the ancho chilies, cinnamon stick, and bay leaf. Put the lid on the slow cooker and braise the short ribs for 6-8 hours until the meat is tender and the bones release from the meat.
- 5. Turn off the heat, remove the bones, bay leaf, and cinnamon, and allow the meat to cool in the braising liquid.
- 6. Prepare the pomegranate pico. Mix the pomegranate seeds, jalapeño, lime juice, and pepitas in a small mixing bowl.
- 7. Roughly chop the meat with the ancho chilies, mixing them together. Taste and season with salt accordingly. If needed, heat the mixture in the braising juices to serving temperature.
 - 8. Warm your tortillas to make them soft and pliable. Eat. Enjoy.
