Mosquito Road Bridge Project

The El Dorado County Department of Transportation (Transportation) will be presenting to the County's Board of Supervisors (BOS) an Addendum to the Environmental Impact Report and design details for the Mosquito Road Bridge at South Fork American River Replacement Project (Project). The purpose of the Project is to replace the existing bridge with a functional bridge that meets current design and safety standards. Transportation is scheduled to present to the BOS on Tuesday, December 10, 2019 at 3:00 PM.

The Project continues to be funded by the Highway Bridge Program and is progressing through the design phase, right of way acquisition, and is moving toward preparation for construction. As part of the BOS presentation, Transportation will be discussing the Project's Addendum to the Final Environmental Impact Report (Addendum). The Addendum focuses on four (4) minor revisions: clarifies a mitigation measure for wildlife biologist monitoring construction activities; adding an option for a culvert pipe instead of an open bottom structure over a small drainage swale; updating estimated impacts to sensitive habitat areas; and, a clarification of the estimated temporary Mosquito Road closures of up to ten (10) weeks during the construction of the bridge.

Within the design phase, final design details for the bridge will be discussed which includes aesthetic rock treatment to selected visible areas of concrete (similar to the Missouri Flat Interchange), and simulated vintage barrier rails. In addition to these aesthetics treatments, features for public safety will be presented. These safety features include the type of barrier rails, potential emergency telephones, signs, and lighting. Final design should be complete within the next year 2020, with construction anticipated to begin in the fall of 2021 pending permits and authorizations.
