CHIEF'S REPORT

<u>Calls for Service</u>: December 24-January 23 Medical Aid - 4 Vehicle Accident - 2 (2 injuries- no transport- storm related) Gas Hazard - 1

Power Line down - 1 (storm related) Structure Fire - 1 (minor damage)

Tuesday night training resumed on January 9th. Training will happen Tuesday evening every other week starting January 23 and will involve a number of topics relevant to the time of year and operations the District normally undertakes. Storm preparedness, structure fire, chimney fire, vehicle accidents and on-going medical training are the current priorities. Various topics will be covered for firefighters and Support Group. The public is invited to observe training, to ask questions and meet our staff.

Six personnel attended and completed a 40-hour State certified class for Apparatus Driver/Operator. The completion of the course allows them to obtain a DMV endorsement for fire engine driving. Qualified personnel will undergo months of driver training and basic pump operation. Each will complete a state recognized "task book", which verifies the minimum basic driving and pumping skills have been achieved. The certified instruction was delivered at Station 75, paid for our FEMA SAFER grant.

We currently have four firefighters in Firefighter 1 academy at Sierra and American River Colleges. One firefighter is starting EMT training with the Sacramento State University program, to be completed in March. The Firefighter 1 academy students will graduate in June. This is a very intense program, requiring the firefighters to attend academy and related training (or physical training), seven days a week. Both EMT and Firefighter 1 training are funded by our FEMA SAFER Grant.

Fifteen support personnel will participate in the Title 22 Public Safety First Aid training course, delivered to Station 75 by the El Dorado Hills Fire Department Training Center. The instruction will happen in March, which is the same delivered to Cal Fire firefighters and police officers, with State Certified curriculum and certificates for successful completion. Personnel will learn the various aspects of first aid and patient assessment, including certification on the administration of Narcan, Epinephrine pens, glucose monitoring and administration, and advanced bleeding control. Attending personnel already have their current CPR/AED, which was taught by Chief Dwyer last summer.

Successful completion of the course and follow-up training by our EMTs and Paramedics will form a basic Medical Response Group, which will assist duty firefighters as needed. The added personnel who have certified skills training will be a tremendous benefit to our community, to compensate for the long response times paramedics have to get to our incidents.

The Fire District was recently awarded \$666,320 from the FEMA SAFER (Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response) program. The grant was applied for in February 2023 and we were successful in the first round of awards. This gives us another four years of grant funding for our productive volunteer program, which has resulted in the fire station being staffed 24/7 for over two years. The funding covers volunteers' stipend pay for shift coverage and response to emergencies, training classes, new volunteer expenses including physicals, background checks, uniforms and safety gear, support of the Explorer program, salary and benefits for a volunteer coordinator (Fire Captain), and more. Residual money from the current grant ending in December 2023 can be used for enhanced marketing and other volunteer support needs. Many thanks for grant writing efforts by Meredith Blain and Didi Everhart (Gatchell Grant Resources-Canton, OH). We are currently awaiting the results of a parallel SAFER grant application for full time station staffing (3 positions- 1 firefighter/supervisor 24/7/365). I have posted a success story about our grant experiences, on the US Congressional website for SAFER and AFG staffing. The District has also been awarded \$10,000 from Cal Fire for wildland PPE and equipment to be spent in the Spring 2024 (50/50 grant- \$10,000 matching from District- \$20,000 purchase total).

Our Fire District staff is fully committed to our Community. We stand ready to assist our residents with any needs they may have, to prepare, support and provide the most up to date information. We are happy to conduct an interior or exterior fire safety inspection upon your request. Please call us at 530-626-9017 or stop by the station.

MVFA UPDATE

SOCIAL MEDIA RESPONSE

The MVFA Board sometimes gets asked, "Why don't you respond to the negative social media posts about the MVFA?" First of all, it is our Board's policy to not engage with individuals who are attempting to generate a negative diatribe or who are disparaging MVFA volunteers. It is our expectation that if individuals have valid concerns or issues with MVFA actions, activities or volunteers, the appropriate venue to address them is at the monthly MVFA board meetings which are open to all Mosquito Fire Protection District residents. We do not believe that conducting business on social media is the most effective and conducive venue for resolving any concerns or complaints. We recognize that there are a few disgruntled individuals in the community who have grudges with past board members and are vindictive and carry a vendetta to enact vengeance. They continue to bring up misdeeds from the past and attribute them to the current board. Our current board's sole objective is to maintain Finnon Lake as a viable fire protection resource through the responsible management of the campground and the diner, and to provide equipment and building improvements to our local fire station. We also strive to create community harmony by providing events for the public, such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Christmas Dinner, Halloween Trunk or Treat, and the Fall Festival, to name a few.

We encourage all individuals to attend our monthly meetings which are held at the Mosquito Fire Station on the first Thursday of the month. Meeting times are posted on social media, at the fire station and at the diner.

FINNON RECREATION AREA DAY USE ANNUAL PASS

In accord with the changes made by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife in 2023, the MVFA is now issuing 365-day Finnon Lake Recreation Area Day Use Annual Passes. Prior to the 2023 change, the MVFA issued a calendar-based annual day use pass that expired on Dec. 31, regardless of when it was issued. This change has made us consistent with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife licensing and fairer to individuals who purchase a pass later in the year.

The annual pass fees for 2024 remain unchanged with the single year annual pass costing \$50, a two-year pass costing \$75 and a five-year pass for \$150. If you are interested in obtaining a 1 year, 2 year or 5 year day use pass, please contact the MVFA at mvFA95667@GMAIL.COM or by calling (530) 409-5515.

As a reminder the Finnon Lake Recreation Area is not located within the Swansboro Property Owners Association and for the day use of activities such as fishing, boating, picnicking, swimming, and disc golf a daily fee or annual pass is required. The daily Day Use fee is \$6.00 for individuals or groups of up to six persons in a single vehicle and is submitted at the main entrance to the park. Fees are collected on the honor system. There is no charge for trail walkers and there is no additional charge to registered campers for any Day Use activity. The Day Use area closes at dark.

COMMUNITY LOSS

The MVFA Board of Directors and MVFA membership were deeply saddened to learn of the passing of long-time Mosquito resident Gary Morris. Gary was a huge asset to our community. He served on the MVFA Board of Directors for a number of years and was a volunteer who, with his Bobcat and chainsaw, donated countless hours of his time and his own money at Finnon Lake Recreation Area. Following the dam restoration, scores of volunteers set out to rebuild the café area, campground, and disc golf course. Gary probably did more than anyone to accomplish these goals. During some tough times for MVFA following the dam restoration, Gary was always there to support MVFA fund raisers, dinners, and events, and rarely uttered a word of complaint or negative comment against anyone. I remember the last time he ran for re- election on the MVFA board, Gary received more votes than any of the other six candidates. He will be sorely missed. Godspeed, my friend.
