Be Prepared For The Cold Winter Heating Season

Facts about home heating fires:

- From 2010-12, an average of 45,200 home heating fires occurred in the United States each year and resulted in an annual average of approximately 155 deaths, 625 injuries and \$351 million in property loss.
- Heating was the second leading cause of home fires, following cooking.
- Home heating fires peaked in the early evening hours between 5 and 9 p.m. with the highest peak between 6 and 8 p.m. This four-hour period accounted for 30% of all home heating fires.
- Home heating fires peaked in January (21%) and 50% of all home heating fires occurred in December, January and February.
- Confined fires, those fires confined to chimneys, flues or fuel burners, accounted for 84% of home heating fires.
- The leading factor contributing to home heating fires (28%) was failure to clean, principally creosote from solid-fueled heating equipment, primarily chimneys.
- Twenty-nine percent of the non-confined home heating fires occurred because the heat source was too close to things that can burn.
- Space heaters, whether portable or stationary, accounted for one-third (33%) of home heating fires and four out of five (81%) of home heating fire deaths.
- Placing things that can burn too close to heating equipment or placing heating equipment too close to things that can burn, such as upholstered furniture, clothing, mattress, or bedding, was the leading factor contributing to ignition in fatal home heating fires and accounted for more than half (53%) of home heating fire deaths.

With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening:

• Ensure your heater and chimney has been inspected and serviced by a qualified professional in the last 12 months. If you are using portable space heaters, plug them directly into a wall outlet, not an extension cord. Keep them 3 feet from anything that can burn. This includes upholstered furniture, bedding, paper, walls and even people.



 Test your smoke alarms and carbon dioxide alarms to ensure they are working correctly. Smoke alarms should be installed in every sleeping room, outside every sleeping area, and every level of your home, including basements. Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed in a central location outside sleeping areas and every level of the home.

<u>SCPOA</u>

Your annual assessment for 2016-17 has been reduced from \$780 to \$720!

At its meeting on December 17, 2015, the SCPOA Board made a set of financial decisions for the 2016-17 fiscal year and beyond that led to this reduction. Thanks go to Barb Mikel and our property manager, Judy Reule, for identifying issues in past Browning studies, that when addressed, enabled this reduction.

First, the Board approved a Browning reserve study with a recommendation that the Association set aside \$150,000 into reserves to insure adequate funds to cover anticipated capital needs over the next 30 years. The Board then approved an annual operating budget of \$203,740 to meet anticipated 2016-17 expenses. When combined, these two items represent a \$509 per lot annual assessment.

The difference between the \$509 per lot needed and the \$720 per assessment will add to the accumulated reserves the Association maintains and which may be applied to completing the first phase of our road upgrade project by accelerating the upgrade of the courts with grindings as well as the other courts already designated for completion next year. Owners and their board must spend time discussing and deciding further reductions and unmet needs over the next year.

The Vegetation Management Program, previously adopted by the Board, caused a lot of concern for a lot of members. As the "window" for spraying has shut until February, the Board sent the program back to committee for additional review and recommendation. The Common Areas Committee will review the plans for Dyer and Trout lakes and the Roads Committee will review the roadside ditch line plans.

In response to our letter to the Department of Transportation regarding trucks and damage to our bridge, Supervisor Ranalli has convened a meeting in mid-January with SCPOA, DOT, and the Highway Patrol. We will let you know what we learn from that meeting next month.

The Mosquito Fire Safe Council, under the direction of Chief Hazlett, is submitting a grant seeking funds to enhance fire protection in the community. As the area which is the focus of the grant is SCPOA common area, the Board agreed to provide \$10,000 in supplemental funds should the grant be awarded by the Council. The decision regarding the grant is expected in March 2016.

Finally, a reminder that the SCPOA Board elections are coming and **January 4**, **2016**, is the deadline for filing candidate statements. The Board will hold a candidate meet and greet on Saturday, January 23, 2016, from 3p.m. – 5p.m. The election results will be announced at the February 13, 2016, General Meeting.

As of this writing, we are looking forward to lots of rain, snow, and holiday cheer. Here's hoping by the time you read it all expectations have been met.

Birding at Finnon Lake

MVFA has a responsibility to monitor the birds, bats, mammals and fish at Finnon Lake as part of a mitigation obligation of the dam project. To cover the bird monitoring, Dee and Mike Taylor have been doing monthly bird walks on the trail around the lake, and have come across a fair number of species that are always enjoyable to see and hear. To get a more comprehensive list we would like anyone birding Finnon to help us by supplying us with your sightings. The easiest way to do this is through eBird (<u>www.ebird.org</u>) which is a birding website (and also an app) utilized across the world to log bird species and locations of sightings. If you sign up in eBird and bird Finnon, please call the location Finnon Lake.

Another easy way to record sighting is to use the birding application named BirdLog (<u>http://www.birdseyebirding.com/apps/birdlog/</u>) which will tell you what birds have been seen in the area recently and what birds would normally be in the area. If you use BirdLog, your sightings automatically upload to the Cornell Ornithology Lab which is the holder of all things bird related.

As bird books and bird applications go for bird identification, Sibley's Field Guide to Birds of Western North America is an excellent source and the electronic IBird Pro (<u>http://ibird.com/app/iphone/ibird-pro-guide-to-birds/</u>) has great information, pictures, audible sounds of the birds and their general range.

If you are interested in going birding and need a little help or even a lot of help identifying the birds, get in touch with me or the Taylors, and we might be able to set up a time to bird Finnon together.
