CHIEF'S REPORT

<u>Calls for Service</u>: November 14-December 19 Fires- 3 (Structure Fire (2)- Dryer Fire, Water Tender request cancelled) Vehicle Accident- 1 (single vehicle rollover (bridge construction zone)- 1 air ambulance), Medical Aid- 2, Public Assist- 5

On Thursday December 15th at 7:03pm, firefighters were dispatched to a structure fire on Stope Dr. There was a fire board study session at Station 75. There were five firefighters in the station at the time along with several Support Group members. All responded immediately. The first units arrived at 7:09pm to find a single story residence heavily involved in fire with flames shooting through the roof. The residents and all but one of their dogs made it safely outside. The one remaining dog was found by the homeowner, revived, given oxygen by firefighters, and is doing well now. Veterinarian Dr. Al Raymond gave the cats a physical exam and treated them for smoke and heat exposure. 21 firefighters, including 10 from Mosquito FD, responded and contained the fire to the house without spreading to two RVs nearby. Thanks to the dedication of our firefighters, two adult cats and two kittens were rescued from a bedroom after the fire had been contained. They are frightened but are doing well. 11 Support Group members responded and provided firefighter rehab (hydration and medical monitoring) and road control. Assistance was provided by Cal Fire, County Fire, and Garden Valley Fire. The fire heavily damaged the house and its contents. The cause is under investigation.

With fire season 2022 now behind us, a reminder that burn permits are required, obtained online only. The Fire District does not issue burn permits, which are under the jurisdiction of Cal Fire and El Dorado County Air Quality District. Burn piles 4'x 4' or smaller, obtain a burn permit at <u>https://burnpermit@fire.ca.gov</u>. For larger burn piles obtain a permit at <u>https://www.edcgov.us/government/airqualitymanagement/burn-permit-application</u>. Burn barrels are not allowed. Firefighters Kyle Elledge and Quintin Anderson have completed State approved Fire Apparatus Operator training through Sierra College. Engineer Devin Hern and Firefighter Coleman Johns continue their Firefighter 1 certification through Consumnes River College, moving onto their Firefighter 2 training with an internship program through the Consumnes Fire District in the Spring. They will be required to work shifts as a part of their practical training and continual skills testing. Firefighter Heidi Glockner and Engineer Ryan Hopkins will attend EMT school in 2023. We are also hoping to place these folks through Firefighter 1 academy, depending on schedules.

This is the time of year, as the season turns cold, to use caution with fireplaces, wood stoves and portable heating devices. Placement of portable heating devices is critical, to prevent the ignition of combustible materials such as beds and couches. <u>An annual safety check and cleaning of the chimney or wood stove pipe will prevent a fire which could spread into the attic</u>. Now is also the time to check batteries for smoke detectors. Always have a functioning carbon monoxide detector. At a recent incident we were reminded to make sure dryer lint is frequently removed. Dryer lint provides a perfect source of fuel for a fire, ignited by high heat. We are happy to conduct an interior or exterior fire safety inspection upon your request. Below is a list of important dates. Community members are always welcome to attend Tuesday night training and meet our firefighters and Support Group members. Our training is currently focused on winter storm preparedness and structure fire response.

We continue to provide addressing signs for residents and installing in the Community. Firefighters put together signs and mount it at the best location at a resident's property. The cost of the sign is \$35. Contact Captain Lugo at <u>mlugo@mfpd.us</u> for ordering.

Why Do I Need to Keep My Dog On A Leash?

If your dog is unleashed and comes across a more aggressive dog on a leash, that dog or your own may feel more anxious or territorial. Every dog is capable of becoming physically engaged with another dog when circumstances create a threatening situation. The only way to safely intervene in these situations is to have a leash on your dog and be in control of the other end. When an unfortunate incident happens, in addition to your dog suffering potential serious injury, you can be held liable for your pet's actions.

Many folks use our lake and not everyone you and your pet encounters are dog lovers. When you are at Finnon Lake you have no idea when you or your pet will come in contact with another individual. You will not know which of the people around you are dog lovers and which may fear or distrust dogs. None of this is your dog's fault, and though most people may love your friendly dog trotting up to them, not all will.

Please be a respectful dog owner and keep your dog on a leash and in your constant control while enjoying the Finnon Lake Recreation Area facilities.

Recipe of the Month

Cranberry Orange Scones

Ingredients

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 10 teaspoons sugar, divided
- 1 tablespoon grated orange zest
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/3 cup cold butter
- 1 cup dried cranberries
- 1/4 cup orange juice
- 1/4 cup half-and-half cream

- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 1 tablespoon 2% milk
- GLAZE (optional):
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 tablespoon orange juice
- ORANGE BUTTER:
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 2 to 3 tablespoons orange marmalade

Directions

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the flour, 7 teaspoons of sugar, orange zest, baking powder, salt, and baking soda. Cut in butter until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs; set aside. In a small bowl, combine the cranberries, orange juice, cream, and egg. Add to flour mixture and stir until a soft dough forms.
- 2. On a floured surface, gently knead 6-8 times. Pat dough into an 8-inch. circle. Cut into 10 wedges. Separate wedges and place them on a greased baking sheet. Brush with milk: sprinkle with remaining sugar.
- 3. Bake at 400° until lightly browned, 12-15 minutes. Remove to a wire rack.
- 4. Combine glaze ingredients if desired; drizzle over scones. Combine orange butter ingredients; serve with warm scones.




