CALL 9-1-1 FOR EMERGENCIES

A number of recent occurrences have led to issuing this critical reminder: WHEN THERE IS AN EMERGENCY, DIAL 9-1-1.

DO NOT ASSUME MOSQUITO STATION 75 IS OCCUPIED DURING ADMIN HOURS Mosquito Station 75 is staffed ONLY from 8:00am-5:00pm, daily. This is NOT a guarantee that the staff is in the station to answer the station phone or receive your walk-in for request for assistance during these staffing hours.

All emergency responses are required to go through 9-1-1 Dispatch. Calling Mosquito Station 75 directly will delay response. Station admins will instruct you to hang up and dial 9-1-1. It happens VERY frequently. Too frequently. DO NOT DELAY RESPONSE--DIAL 9-1-1

THERE IS A 9-1-1 CALL BOX AT THE STATION FRONT DOOR

If you happen to come to the station, do not ring the doorbell for emergency assistance. Do not knock and yell for help expecting someone upstairs to come to the door. DIAL 9-1-1 directly from the Call Box at the station's front door. Press the call button to dial directly to a dispatcher for immediate assistance.

WE ARE STILL A VOLUNTEER DEPENDENT DISTRICT

The budget constraints of our district allow for staffing from 8:00am-5:00pm, daily. We are critically dependent on volunteers that reside in the district from 5:00pm-8:00am each night. Resident resources are issued pagers that activate an alert when a 9-1-1 dispatch is initiated.

We are very fortunate to have the in-district resources available to respond. We are making a conscious effort of ensuring our district has resources available at all hours of the day, every day. This is NOT always a guarantee given the limited numbers of qualified personnel that we have. Remember, your best chance at getting assistance is dialing 9-1-1.

MVFA likes to welcome new members to our community with a welcome bag of information about our community, our organization and Finnon Lake Recreation Area. Our community is dependent on our Fire Department to enable Mosquito residents to live safely in an area so close to nature and we are eternally grateful for Chief Eddie Dwyer and the paid and volunteer members of the Mosquito Fire Department who take the risks and give their time to protect our community.

As a reminder, when the former Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department (MVFD) reorganized from a volunteer fire department to the MVFA, a community and fire department support organization, it submitted an Amendment of Articles of Incorporation. In it, MVFA stated that, "All of the activities conducted by the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association are performed by volunteers", and that these activities include:

- a) Providing equipment to firefighters through its fund raising events.
- b) Publishing the Mosquito Byte monthly newsletter.

c) Youth Community events: Easter Egg Hunt, Summer Picnic, Halloween Party and Christmas Party.

- d) Assisting the elderly including: holiday food and gift baskets, clearing areas of brush and debris around residences for fire safety, providing firewood for home heating and other assistance as requested.
- e) Firefighter training at Finnon Lake Recreation Area, and maintaining the area used for training.
- f) General public recreational activities at Finnon Lake Recreation Area (FLRA).
- g) Camp ground: maintaining the sites, bathrooms and refuse area.

In addition, as a community service MVFA publishes the Mosquito Phone Book every two years which includes information and a street map of the area.

A small Day Use fee is collected at Finnon Lake for activities such as fishing, boating, picnicking and Disc Golf. A Resident Annual Day Use Pass is available to Mosquito residents for \$50. (See below.) Unlike other membership organizations in the area, who charge at least \$600 annually whether the members use the facilities or not, only users pay at FLRA. These fees help pay the costs associated with operating the park.

MVFA is organized as a non-profit tax exempt entity and is funded entirely by grants, donations, fund raisers and rents and fees at Finnon Lake - which it owns. MVFA receives no tax revenues, nor any dues money from SCPOA. As per IRS mandate, MVFA gives no cash nor has any financial connection to any non-501(c)(3) organization or to the Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD). MVFA has no paid employees, and operates primarily with volunteers who donate their own time and often their own money to make our community a better place. If you would like to enhance your membership in MVFA, please become a volunteer.

If you can't volunteer, please consider a donation to MVFA. We have a community fund designed to help neighbors in need, and the MVFA Station 75 Fund that provides funds to purchase tools and other items at the Chief's request. And there are always maintenance and improvement projects at the Fire Station and at Finnon Lake Recreation Area. Many thanks to the many community members who have donated very generously to MVFA - in time and money - over the past years.

MVFA is a 501(c)(3) organization and donations may be tax deductible. A letter stating your donation will be provided on request. Send your donation to MVFA, 9009 Orval Beckett Ct., Placerville CA 95667.

MVFA values and promotes voluntary efforts in our community. MVFA continues to carry on the work begun by its predecessors many years ago.
