Transitions

The Fire District is in transition, our community is in transition and Mother Nature is in transition. The Fire District is are in transition also as we move

toward having front-line, limited-time paramedics. I, too, will be going through the county Emergency Services Accreditation process very shortly. As mentioned previously, this will require me to complete what is called a 10-call evaluation of my skills and abilities, along with a written protocol test, followed up by an interview with Dr. Brazzell from County Emergency Medical Services. We have a single hurdle for Fire Engine Paramedics, and that is our final inspection by the County Emergency Medical Services. This inspection, hopefully, occurred on May 26, 2017. As soon as we receive the results of this review, we will receive an EKG Monitor Defibrillator from the El Dorado County Ambulance Joint Powers Authority (JPA). In fact, we will receiving two EKG Monitor Defibrillators, which is a cost savings to the district of about \$75,000.00. We hope to have the first on-duty operational paramedic on the Engine before the end of May, and no later than mid-June.

Nature is in her spring-to-summer transition. This time of year is deceptive and can be dangerous. Remember, there is a lot of water flowing through the rivers and creeks as alpine snow melts cause our rivers to rise. At the same time, the water is frigid, just above 42 degrees. Survival in such cold water is less likely because the cold will cause a person to quickly lose consciousness. The rivers are moving swiftly, and there are currents below the surface of the waterways that are also deceptive. A slow moving river can have subsurface water flows that are as dangerous as a coastal riptide. Please take extra precautions when planning to raft the rivers and creeks. Also, please make sure that family knows where you are going, where you are planning to set in and pull out of the river.

We are also in a deceptive period for wildland fires. Many people will look at the grass and think it still looks fairly green; so people become complacent. However, it is truly capable of burning, and there was a reported loss of control of a controlled burn many days in May. So please keep your burn piles at the size requirements you signed for, and just because it's a burn day, it still might not be the best idea to burn.

When using a weed whacker to cut down weeds, try to avoid using metal blades. These blades can cause a spark and ignite grass fires easily. Also, broadcast burning of your property should not be done and doing so could cause you to be fined by CALFIRE.

We are in a beautiful time of year. Enjoy what you see. The rivers are flowing high and are beautiful. If you choose to play in the waterways, please take precautions to secure your safety, use flotation vests and appropriate wet gear. And remember, the green grass of May can burn as intensely as the yellow grass of August. Stay safe and should you ever have a question about safety concerns please do not hesitate to call for a property fire safety inspections.

Over the last several months I have had many community members contact me, either in person or by email, regarding DCCR complaints.

If you feel uncomfortable to approach a neighbor and have the need to make a complaint, please use the appropriate complaint procedure. This includes, filling out a complaint form and submitting it to The Management Trust. You can submit your form either by email, in person, or you can call them up directly and ask for assistance.

Email for The Management Trust can be accessed through their website at (www.management trust.com) or call them directly at (916) 985-3633, and ask either for Megan Malmgren ext. 5139 or Rick LaFrance ext. 5160.

If you do not know if your complaint falls under a violation of the DCCR's, you can always ask someone from The Management Trust.

Non DCCR complaints can be made through the following agencies:

Vehicle Abatement: For abandoned or vehicles parked on the shoulder of the roadway, through the El Dorado County Sheriff's Department at (530) 621-5655

El Dorado Code Enforcement: For nuisances, persons dumping contaminated waste and persons living in campers or trailers without a temporary occupancy permit or in tents. (530) 621-5999

El Dorado County Animal Services: For barking dogs, crowing roosters, animal livestock violations, and cruelty to animals (530) 621-5795

El Dorado County Sheriff's Department For unlawful acts such as suspicion of domestic violence occurring, child abuse, drug issues, shooting off fire arm issues, or any suspicious activity (530) 621-5655
