Chiefs Corner

Snow in April! Not the first time that it has happened. In fact, I'm told that we generally get a dusting of snow every April. Perhaps that's Mother Nature's way of ushering in Spring here "On the Hill". Speaking of Spring, it's here and with it we can expect dry conditions and probably an enormous amount of vegetation from the late moisture we received. Please, be extra vigilant with open flames or other potential ignition sources when you are in or around vegetation.



The District:

The District is in the process of developing the 2018-2019 Budget. It's unfortunate, but once again we are most likely going to have to take money from our Reserve Fund to balance the budget. This is the 3rd consecutive year that Reserve funds were needed to maintain the current level of service. If this continues without an increase in revenue, our Reserve Fund will be depleted in 3-4 years. Want to have a say in how the District spends its revenue? Well, come to the **May 10th** Board Meeting (7PM at the fire station) where the Directors will again be trying to find ways to reduce expenditures or increase revenue.

The Department:

During the month of March, the district was staffed during normal duty hours with Paramedics for 25 days. This translates to 60% of the medical calls that occurred in March had Fire Based Paramedics on scene before ambulance arrival. The District also had ALS (Advanced Life Support) Coverage in the overnight hours during those periods of severe, inclement weather when the potential for road closures due to slides was the greatest.

Personnel:

We have added a third EMT Volunteer to cover the district 12 hours per week in the overnight hours. This provides us with three EMT Volunteers who, on completion of a year's service commitment, will be sponsored by the District for the Firefighter Academy at Sierra College.

The Station:

The electrical panel at the station has been upgraded. The upgrade included separating circuits and upgrading circuit breakers.

Equipment:

Our aggressive maintenance programs have provided a cost savings to the district. It keeps minor repairs minor, is cost effective, and at this point of the year, is under budget.

Engine 275 Experiencing rear hub seal issues. Our contract mechanic is in contact with the chassis manufacturer to identify the best repair process. The engine also had dash lights and minor air leaks repaired. The engine remains in service.

At the last MFPD Support Group meeting on April 7th, 5 of the 7 members of the MVFA Board of Directors (one spouse) received new I.D. cards identifying them as members of the MFPD Support Group. The group meets for training on the first Saturday of each month during most of the year.

The MVFA board is continuing to review and make changes to its By-laws. The present By-laws are a carry-over from its pre-2006 days as the 501(c)(4) Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department (MVFD) which purchased the Finnon Lake property. The idea was to rebuild the condemned dam and restore Finnon Lake as a principle source of water for fire control. Since the Finnon Lake dam was rebuilt however, MVFA's financial responsibilities have increased dramatically. Besides the annual dam inspection fee of almost \$8,000 (and rising every year), property taxes and insurance amounts to over \$3,000 annually. The primary reason for reorganizing as a 501(c)(3) and changing its name to MVFA was to separate these financial liabilities from district taxpayers.

MVFA is organized as a non-profit tax-exempt entity and is funded entirely by grants, donations, fund raisers and rents and fees at Finnon Lake, which it owns. MVFA receives no tax revenues, nor any dues money from SCPOA. As per IRS mandate, MVFA gives no cash nor has any financial connection to any non-501(c)(3) organization or to the Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD). MVFA has no paid employees, and operates primarily with volunteers who donate their own time and often their own money to make our community a better place. If you would like to enhance your membership in MVFA, please become a volunteer.

If you can't volunteer, please consider a donation to MVFA. We have a community fund designed to help neighbors in need, and the MVFA Station 75 Fund that provides funds to purchase tools and other items at the Chief's request. And there are always maintenance and improvement projects at the Fire Station and at Finnon Lake Recreation Area. Many thanks to the many community members who have donated very generously to MVFA over the past year.

Largemouth bass, Bluegills and Red-eared Sunfish are starting to show along the shoreline shallows and across the dam front. But we haven't yet seen them feeding on surface lures or flies. Leech patterns are working well on all four species (sub-surface). Trout still can be seen rising in the early mornings and evenings and several are big enough to indicate they are holdover trout from last May's CA Fish and Wildlife's stocking. This years stocked trout have been a little less aggressive, but are being caught from time to time.

Recipe of the Month - Old Fashion Potato Salad

Ingredients

- 4 cups cubed peeled potatoes
- 3 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- 2 celery ribs, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup chopped green onions
- 1/4 cup diced red onion
- 1/4 cup sweet relish
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons Champagne vinegar
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions

Place potatoes in a saucepan and cover with water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Cook for 20-25 minutes or until tender; drain, while still hot drizzle the champagne vinegar over the potatoes and let cool. Place in a large bowl; add eggs, celery and onions.

In a small bowl, combine the remaining ingredients. Pour over potato mixture and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Yield: 6-8 servings.
