### **Chief's Report**

The Fire District was pleased and honored to host a community meeting for the new bridge construction, presented by the El Dorado County Department of Transportation. The meeting was Thursday April 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:00pm. This project has been in the planning phases for many years, but it is not a reality until now, thanks to confirmed Federal Funding with a successful bid process. Details of the information gathered from the meeting will be provided on the Fire District's website and social media. Much appreciation to our firefighters and Support Group who provided a BBQ meal for our residents prior to the meeting.

The Fire District will be coordinating a Community Evacuation Drill on Saturday June 11<sup>th</sup> at 12:00pm. The airport and surrounding areas of Dyer and Trout lakes will be used to stage residents, vehicles and possibly large animals (large animal rescue volunteers will be present and testing procedures). In the event of fire, time will of the essence for safe evacuation. Our simulation tests the Department's standard operating procedures and presumes the Mosquito Bridge is closed (due to new bridge construction). After the drill there will be a fire safety event hosted by SCPOA and the Mosquito Fire Safe Council (lunch provided). Fire District trucks and equipment will be there for demonstrations, displays and hands-on activities for kids.

Recent storms have been a welcome relief for dangerously dry vegetation. As the rainfall diminishes and we have warmer temperatures, native grasses will dry out and the burn season will soon be over. It will be important to get your burning done safely as soon as possible. Please follow all burn permit requirements, which can be obtained on-line. The Fire District does not issue burn permits, which are under the jurisdiction of Cal Fire and El Dorado County Air Quality District. Burn piles 4'x 4' or smaller, obtain a burn permit at https://burnpermit@fire.ca.gov. For larger burn piles obtain permit at https://www.edcgov.us/government/airgualitymanagement/burn-permit-application. Burn barrels are not allowed. Always call or check our website to see if it's a burn day before proceeding.

Cal Fire will be continuing vegetation management inspections in our community next month. They will be out enforcing defensible space regulations around homes (30-100 foot clearance). The purpose of the inspections are educational but they do have the option to issue warning and citations.

I reported last month about El Dorado Hills FD doing defensible space inspections in our District. After discussion with El Dorado Hills FD and the County, they will not be inspecting, considering Cal Fire has already been working with our residents on the same inspections. Our District will handle the County vegetation complaints (under the County's "Good Neighbor" ordinance) and work with residents to gain compliance. We did this last year and will continue this year, in close coordination with the County.

Emergency Medical Responder training (80 hrs) will be scheduled to begin in March. We will have six Department volunteers taking the class, along with people off the Hill, who have registered through the hired instructor. This will give us additional personnel to respond and assist with medical emergencies.

Wildland season will soon be here and we are actively focusing all training on firefighting preparedness. Our OES engine (4613) will return to Station 75 Friday April 22<sup>nd</sup> after months being away getting repaired (supply chain issues with parts). We have been successful in adding additional firefighter graduates the wildland academy, created, and organized by a Pioneer FD firefighter. The academy is recognized by the Folsom Lake College and County ROP fire training programs.

We will receive brand new Scott breathing apparatus within the next few weeks. The regional FEMA Assistance to Firefighter grant (Mosquito, Pioneer, Georgetown) will pay for full replacement of our breathing apparatus and air masks. There was approximately \$9,500 in excess grant money from the funds assigned to us, which will purchase a turnout extractor (washing machine) and additional radio pagers for our volunteers. A special thanks to the Pioneer Fire District for writing and sponsoring this very important grant. Our current breathing apparatus, purchased reconditioned last year, will be used as backup and training. All of our current breathing apparatus parts and pieces are compatible with the new units coming in. The new units were purchased through the Cal Fire contract with the Scott breathing apparatus vendor. Scott breathing apparatus is now with all El Dorado County west slope fire districts.

The Fire District will be conducting annual fire safety inspections on all non-residential hangers at the airport. The purpose is fire safety education/awareness, firefighter safety and pre-fire planning. Please contact me to schedule an inspection, at your convenience, if you own or rent a hanger.

We continue to seek interest from the Community for those interesting in CERT training. CERT basic training consists of approximately 30 hours of basic disaster preparedness training delivered in a flexible format over several months. Those taking the training will be much better prepared for emergency and disaster situations at home and elsewhere. Additional training will be available for those who wish to expand their knowledge and become certified volunteer responders to emergency incidents. ### Finnon Lake News

Finnon Lake Recreation Area is owned and maintained by the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association (MVFA) and is open from spring to fall with maintenance activities during the winter months for camping, fishing, boating, swimming, picnicking and disc golf. The MVFA Board of Directors is responsible for paying the costs of keeping Finnon Lake Recreation Area operating safely and always improving. The MVFA Board is responsible for payments of more than \$40,000 in annual bills (dam fees, insurance, taxes and maintenance costs) to keep the park open to the public. Finnon Lake is a valuable community asset with potential for recreation and fire abatement. Neither Finnon Lake nor MVFA is part of the Mosquito Fire Department (MFPD) and receives no money from MFPD or any other tax source. MVFA is totally self-supported by park fees, rents, donations and fund-raiser events. All adult residents in the Mosquito Fire Protection District are automatically members of MVFA.

A \$6.00 Day Use fee for day use activities - swimming, fishing, boating (including inflatables), and picnicking and disc golf - is collected on the honor system. Hiking, walking, bird watching and bicycling at Finnon are free of charge. Camping is by reservation only - thru HipCamp.com. Every dollar collected from park fees and donations goes to paying bills, improving the site and supporting the Mosquito Fire Department. The café is leased to a

concessionaire who has full responsibility for its operation and upkeep. Volunteer residents donate their time to help with maintenance, improvements, websites and reservations, Mosquito Byte, Mosquito Phone Book, MVFA events and other projects.

Recently, the Finnon Lake Dam received its annual inspection by the California Department of Water Resources, Division of Safety of Dams. MVFA volunteers cleared the dam spillway, and prepared the outflow valve for the required fully open to fully closed inspection routine.

In addition, seven new picnic tables are being added at the Finnon campground to replace some of the older ones, and adding tables to the Day Use area. Sugar Pine logs were donated by local residents, and boards for the tables were milled by Tom Harris at his local private mill. Thanks to volunteers Trent Williams and Dave Angelo for putting the tables together and delivering them to the campground.

And thanks to the many resident volunteers for keeping the Finnon property maintained and running smoothly. Doing so keeps the visitors coming to Finnon Lake Recreation Area, and allows the MVFA board to continue its support of the fire department. Finnon Lake has always played a valuable role in support of the Mosquito Fire Department, and is a valuable resource for fire safety. In the event of a fire, the campground is used as a safe area, and the lake is used to fill the water tenders and for helicopters to pull water.

### Did you know?

Here is the last entry regarding the incubation process of the bald eagles. They have a "brood patch" which is a bare skin area on their breast that is formed when the eagle removes its own feathers from that location. By removing the feathers, the eagle allows its body heat to better reach the eggs to keep them at the proper (105 degrees) temperature. The Finnon Lake bald eagles have incubated their eggs in the nest for the 34-36 day incubation period and their posture behavior the past 3 weeks indicates that the egg(s) have hatched. As of April 11 at least 2 Eaglets have been spotted in the nest.

How about a special treat for Mom? You can make this a day ahead and bake it when you need it.

### **Ingredients**:

**Directions:** 

12 slices of day-old bread, cut into 1-inch cubes
2 (8 ounces) packages of cream cheese, cut into 1-inch cubes
12 eggs, beaten
2 cups milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/₃ cup maple syrup
1 cup white sugar
1 cup fresh blueberries
2 tablespoons cornstarch

1 cup water

1 cup fresh blueberries

1 tablespoon butter

**Step 1 -** Lightly grease a 9x13 inch baking dish. Arrange half the bread cubes in the dish, and top with cream cheese cubes. Sprinkle 1 cup of blueberries over the cream cheese, and top with the remaining bread cubes.

**Step 2 -** In a large bowl, mix the eggs, milk, vanilla extract, and syrup. Pour over the bread cubes. Cover, and refrigerate overnight.

**Step 3 -** Remove the bread cube mixture from the refrigerator about 30 minutes before baking. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

**Step 4 -** Cover, and bake for 30 minutes. Uncover, and continue baking for 25 to 30 minutes, until the center is firm and the surface is lightly browned.

**Step 5 -** In a medium saucepan, mix the sugar, cornstarch, and water. Bring to a boil. Stirring constantly, cook for 3 to 4 minutes. Mix in the remaining 1 cup of blueberries. Reduce heat, and simmer for 10 minutes, until the blueberries burst. Stir in the butter, and pour over the baked French Toast
