Chief's Corner

There are many things going on here at the fire station. We have been able to accomplish a lot for the community. Squad 75 is in service. Squad 75 is a light duty vehicle which is fully equipped to handle medical emergencies. Squad 75 has a full complement of basic life support and advanced life support equipment. When a paramedic is on duty, the squad can deliver cardiac assessment through EKG, including full 12-lead EKG and interpretation. We are in discussion with the county JPA to obtain authorization to transport patients to a Helistop, or in times of extreme weather and if Rock Creek Road is closed, to transport medical patients



across the Mosquito bridge then transfer the patient to an incoming JPA Ambulance.

When you drive past the fire station you will see work happening on the west side. We found a considerable amount of dry rot and are in the process of re-siding the station. All the labor is provided by your firefighters! We seriously take to heart the fact that we are the stewards of the fire station, the equipment and the funds that you provide this fire district. We try to do more every day with what we have.

There have been many falsehoods placed on social media. Much of it is purposeful twisting of statements made to validate personal agendas. Over the last two years we have done all we can to meet the Grand Jury's expectations. We have done all we can to maintain as high a level of transparency as possible. So, let me take this time to clear some things up.

Yes, the district will be bringing to the residents of the community a ballot request for increased taxes for service. These funds will go directly to the fire district and not the county coffers.

Yes, through the ballot you; the individual, will have a say in what happens. This can only pass with the community's say so. It cannot be mandated on you by the fire board or myself.

Yes, we are in discussion with Garden Valley Fire Protection District for consolidation. Yes, the public will have a say in consolidation. If the process moves forward to a point that it appears that this will indeed move forward, El Dorado County LAFCO (Local Agency Formation Commission) will send out mail-in ballots for the community to decide to consolidate or not. If we receive less than 25% negative response, then the measure moves forward. Between 26 and 49%, then the measure goes to a full ballot. With 50% or greater the initiative fails, and LAFCO will not permit the process to continue.

We continue to explore options that can bring greater income into the district without having to go to the citizen hat-in-hand. We do all we can to ensure that all funds expended are done so with the greatest fiscal responsibility. Every expenditure, every dollar is accounted for.

There are statements that have been made that the tax increase measure was done in haste and secrecy, which is not true. We have had this on the agenda many times over the last two years and almost monthly for the last year. This is fully open information to the community. The agendas and meeting minutes are all available online, as is the budget and fiscal information of the fire district.

In the upcoming year, there will be many changes in the district, from board members, a new fire chief and personnel. We will continue to move forward knowing we are only the stewards of the fire district. Though we have taken on the ownership of the fire station and have done all we can to be responsive to the fire safety and emergency management, but the true owners of this Fire District are you. We thank you for the privilege to serve you.

The next MFPD Board meeting is Thursday, November 8th at 7 p.m. at the Fire Station.

And don't forget our Toys for Tots toy drive. MVFA is teaming with the Marine Corps Toys for Tots program. There will be a donation barrel located at the Fire Station. Gifts for children should be unwrapped so they can be matched to the children's ages and please don't forget our pre-teens and teenagers. Thank you.

During October, MVFA took nominations for the three open seats on the MVFA Board of Directors - by US mail or email. Nominations for representation on the Board will be placed on the ballot during our regular Board meeting in November following the priorities outlined in Article III of the MVFA bylaws, which are posted on the GoMVFA.com website under "Who Are We". General elections will now take place by hand or written ballot at the general membership meeting in December to prevent interference with the MVFA Christmas Dinner.

MVFA community events such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween Trunk-R-Treat (formerly the Halloween Party) and community dinner events have been sponsored by the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department (MVFD) dating back to its formation in 1972. In late 2006, on the advice of the attorney for the taxpayer supported Mosquito Fire Protection District and explained on the GoMVFA.com website, the MVFD reorganized as a 501c3 non-profit, and changed its name to the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association. As a 501c3, MVFA is forbidden by IRS rules to give cash to any non-501c3 organization - including the Mosquito Fire Department. MVFA maintains a Station 75 Fund, to

which anyone can donate, and the money is used to <u>buy</u> tools, equipment, station improvements and other non-budgeted items at the Chief's request. At most MVFA fundraiser events taking place at the Fire Station, a portion of the proceeds automatically goes to the MVFA Station 75 fund.

Today, MVFA carries on the same traditional events that were begun by its predecessor - MVFD. MVFA volunteers are residents who simply want to give back to their community, and make it a better place. MVFA is totally self-supporting. No one is forced to pay any dues, and MVFA receives no taxpayer money. If one chooses to not support the mission, goals and/or events sponsored by MVFA, no one is forced to pay or participate. If anyone has a complaint against MVFA, the board wants to hear about it - individually and immediately, to get the issue resolved - as adults.

Because of its history, MVFA has always had strong ties to the Mosquito Fire Department. Former Chiefs and fire fighters have been members of the MVFA Board of Directors. MVFA By-laws have ALWAYS specified giving Fire Fighter personnel top priority in the nomination process for membership on the MVFA Board of Directors. At present, six of the eight MVFA officers and directors are card-carrying volunteer members of the Mosquito Fire Protection District.

MVFA respects our veterans, peace officers and our flag, and supports the Chief and the excellent staff of our fire department. If you wish to enhance your membership in MVFA, or seek a position on the board, become a volunteer on one of our many committees - at Finnon or at any MVFA annual event. SCPOA *Report* - A Call to Serve on the SCPOA Board.

It is truly astonishing how tough it is to get folks to serve on the SCPOA Board. It is also equally astonishing how some volunteers manage to serve for numerous terms - as have several of our current Board members. But ultimately, we all need a break. These volunteers put in a lot of their time serving the community. They view this as their civic duty, not for personal gain or some ego gratification. They get their reward from helping others. Some even go a step further, putting in extra time and effort in more ways than just going to meetings (witness the recent playground construction by volunteers and undertaking the bark beetle infestation challenge). Board members may not always agree on everything, but are passionate to do what is in the best interest of our community. Their

service is laudable. Without them, SCPOA would not be this extraordinarily beautiful place in the Sierra foothills many of us call home. They deserve our thanks and respect.

According to SCPOA Bylaws Article VII, the affairs of the Association shall be managed by a board of not less than three (3) nor more than seven (7) directors. The Association members at each annual meeting shall elect directors to fill the vacancies for a term of two (2) years. This year there are four (4) directors (Connell Persico, Jerry Pullin, Gordon Smith and Scott Butler) whose terms will expire in January, 2019. The three remaining directors' (Debbie Harris, Paul Beacham and Roger Stenbock) terms expire in January, 2020. Thus, four (4) director positions will be open for election this January. The October 2018 SCPOA Newsletter (available at scopa.info) had this information in part: "...It also is not too early to begin thinking about the next SCPOA Board election. The election cycle is voting in January for candidates who will take office in mid-February. Declarations of intent to run will be due in December. There will be at least two vacancies on the Board as both Jerry Pullin and Connell Persico have declared they will not run for reelection. The issues of assessments, level of regulation through our DCR's, and common area usage will remain in front of us. There are strong disagreements among current Board members on some of these issues and these disagreements will carry forward to the new Board. We encourage you to know/learn what you want from your Association, learn where each candidate aligns with your wishes and vote on that alignment..."

According to the information from TMT (The Management Trust), as of this report, "The Annual Membership meeting will be held February 9, 2019 at 10 AM. There are four (4) openings on the Board of Directors for a service of two (2) years. If you are interested in serving on the Board of Directors and would like to be listed as a candidate for the upcoming election, please mail, email or fax this form to The Management Trust, Northern California Division, so that it arrives no later than December 4, 2019 at 5:00 PM...." The form includes contact information and the candidate's message. This form should be available from the Manager, or scpoa.info (https://scpoa.info/application-for-board).

Finding volunteers willing to serve the Association is always challenging. But your community really needs your help. If you are interested in volunteering, working long hours for the satisfaction you are doing your civic duty and making your community a better place, why not throw your hat into the ring and run for the board. If you accept the challenge, I look forward to serving with you on the SCPOA Board for the remainder of my term. Until the next time, enjoy the great fall colors.
