SCPOA Report

The treasurer reported that last month the association was under budget again. Approximately \$615,000 was moved into 9 CD's with an average rate of return of 1.94, this should generate an additional \$14,000 in the next year. This is a significantly better return then the



interest generated in basic bank accounts over the last couple of years and just as safe. There is still \$77,000 owed by members for dues.

The maintenance crew purchased a power washer and is in the process of painting the pavilion, they have also been going around and picking up the logs left behind by the last PG & E contractor. The giant pile of chips by the shed is available to anyone to pick up on their own or arrange with the maintenance crew to help them load. The caution is they are not quality landscape chips, they contain everything that was put through the chipper including poison oak but still can work for many purposes.

Mark Egbert, the administrator of the fire grant, is in the process of getting bids for the clearing of Rock Creek Road and the One Eye Creek and Swansboro Road areas. Two signs were purchased and will be installed on entry roads. Any work homeowners do or pay for can be used as in kind work for grant. The El Dorado Fire Safe Council is offering seniors and veterans free assistance with clearing their properties through a grant they received. You can contact them at 647-1700 and leave a message with any questions.

Letters are still being received regarding clearing any required obstacles from the runway, all have been positive. There is still a problem of one owner feeding wildlife next to the airport, it was suggested that the board should take some action as there was another close call recently. The airport committee chair will be discussing with attorney.

The board approved a \$500 expense to purchase blue reflectors to mark the locations of fire hydrants making them easier to see at night.

The board has scheduled road and runway spraying for October 28th if weather conditions are acceptable.

A number of community members brought concerns to the board again about using the well at Dyer to fill it and the effects on surrounding properties. Several owners presented evidence of dirty and clogged filters coinciding with this pumping which had not occurred in the past even during the long drought period. One member suggested that if the board wants the lake to look good for property values then all should share in the cost by budgeting and use the EID valve to fill the lake as it was installed to do and has been done in the past. The cost of potential damage to the wells of those living in the Dyer Lake area has potential to be significant and, as was pointed out by several members, Dyer is not a primary source of water during a fire. Recipe of the Month

Fall is here...let's make some soup...

Pumpkin Chipotle Soup

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 4 cups vegetable stock
- 1 (29 ounce) can pumpkin puree
- 2 chipotle peppers in adobo sauce, minced

- 1 1/2 cups half-and-half cream
- 2 tablespoons *Sofrito*
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon paprika

Directions

Melt the butter in a large saucepan over medium heat. Stir in the flour and cook until the flour has turned golden brown, about 3 minutes. Whisk in the vegetable stock and bring to a boil over high heat. Whisk in the pumpkin puree until no lumps remain, then add the chipotle peppers, half-and-half cream, *sofrito*, Worcestershire sauce, salt, and paprika. Return to a simmer, then reduce heat to medium-low, and cook for 8 minutes until thickened and hot.

Basic Sofrito

- 2 medium green peppers (seeds removed)
- 1 red sweet pepper (seeds removed)
- 2 large tomatoes
- 2 medium onions (peeled)
- 1 head of garlic (peeled)
- 1 bunch cilantro leaves
- 1/2 bunch parsley leaves
 - 1) Peel the garlic and onion and chop, along with the other ingredients, into sizes that are small enough to fit into a <u>food processor</u> or blender. You don't have to dice them finely as you will be processing them. Focus on removing the seeds and any tougher stems that might leave grit in the finished Sofrito. Place the chopped ingredients into a food processor or blender. You can process in batches if your food processor isn't big enough to accommodate it all at once.
 - 2) Blend all ingredients well. You want the finished Sofrito to be finely processed. If you're not familiar with Sofrito, think of it being the consistency of pesto, a thick paste.
 - 3) Once blended, your Sofrito is ready to use. For immediate use, store the Sofrito in a glass container. Plastic containers are not ideal because plastic will absorb the odor of garlic and onions.

This is an awesome way of using up the last of your garden too.
