Chief's Report

<u>Summary</u>: This month has gone by quickly with many projects in progress. We continue to work on grant management and refining our grant expense tracking. This month has been a reminder of how serious fire season can be. Each new year in the State seems to break new records for acreage and structures burned. The tremendous losses due to lightening activity in August also reminds us that the critical fire season months area still ahead.



The opening of the Mosquito Bridge on 8/27 was welcome news. Based on our evacuation procedures, we will maintain road control on Mosquito Road to the bridge to ensure that vehicles leaving are not oversized or pulling trailers. A fire might also be impacting Mosquito Road leading to the bridge; in that case we would maintain road closure until relieved by law enforcement personnel. Based on our procedures, the Airport remains the primary temporary safe refuge area for residents to go to in the event of evacuation. Keeping the roadways clear for emergency vehicles to get into our community will remain a priority.

We have recently received important donations from SCPOA, MVFA and the Swansboro Pilots Association. The SCPOA Board generously donated \$2,500 towards the purchase of Automatic Defibrillators (AED). The Swansboro Pilots Association generously added \$500 for a total of six AEDs and an additional training AED. These AEDs are compatible for both adults and children. The MVFA recently generously donated \$1,200 for the purchase of badges for our personnel. We appreciate how our Community supports us. An incredibly special thank you to the MVFA, Swansboro Pilots Association and SCPOA.

On 8/2, Engine 275 deployed to the Stagecoach Fire in Kern County (assigned to Riverside incident before arriving there and being diverted) and returned on Friday evening 8/14. On Saturday 8/15 at 10:20pm, Engine 275 responded again with four other districts to the Loyalton Fire (47,000 acres) in the Tahoe National Forest above Truckee. The engines responded initial attack to the fire and upon arrival worked all night and following day. Crews fought intense and dangerous fires over the next few days. After receiving lightning and rain the strike team was shifted to the Plumas (North) Complex (62,000 acres) on 8/19. After arriving at the Quincy Fairgrounds, the engines were assigned to protect structures at the Claremont Fire. The crews experienced intense fire during their assignments and as the incident subsided, they were released and returned home on Saturday 8/29. Engine 275 spent almost a month on the road assisting communities in need, protecting lives, and saving homes. We thank B/C Schwegler, Capt. Alyssa Sample, Engineer Jeff Schwegler, Firefighters Greyson Dillender and Devin Hern for their extraordinary and courageous work. Everywhere Engine 275 went they represented the Mosquito Community with distinction. I also thank our superb staff who stayed behind to make sure our District was well covered.

I am pleased and proud to report that retired Fire Chief Leo Chaloux, will be rejoining our ranks to assist us on several important projects, including the development of our volunteer program, recruitment from the community. Chief Chaloux will also be assisting as a volunteer Battalion Chief on emergency incidents at various times. His knowledge and expertise of emergency response to the community is well known and respected.

Community based volunteers are essential to the Fire District's emergency response. We have already interviewed four community members who are interested in joining the District. One is a new community member; two are volunteers who were with the District previously and one with radio expertise willing to assist us with alternative communications during critical events.

Volunteer Firefighters: Our four active volunteers continue with their training and experience. Two of the four participated in the strike team response. Firefighter Greyson Dillender staffed Engine 275 on both strike team deployments with B/C Schwegler. Firefighter Devin Hern was with the engine on the second deployment to the Loyalton and Claremont Fires. The experience and training provided during these deployments cannot be understated relative to the skills and confidence these young men bring back to the District. A third volunteer assisted us with night staffing at the Station. A special thanks to Assistant Chief Todd Hern for his many hours of coverage and leadership while engine and crew were out of the District. Todd's value to the District and our emergency response to the community cannot be overstated.

Support Group: The Support Group is always excellent, strongly assisting us with responses and other projects. The Group had their monthly training on Saturday September 1. They covered the new firefighter rehabilitation function, radio training and helicopter landing zone management. On September 15, the Group perform a drafting/water tender refill operation at Catfish Lake. This area (Buckboard) lacks adequate water supply for firefighting. The joint training with Support Group and firefighting staff had the opportunity for personnel to review firefighting procedures and effective water tender refill operations.

It has been so nice to get great locally grown fresh produce in such a convenient location. MVFA has purchased the old generator from the fire station and is having it installed at the diner. This will make it so much easier for Frank to continue to operate when we have power outages. Two very successful disc golf tournaments were held at Finnon recently, the disc golf volunteer crew was able to get the 27th basket finished and cleared in time for use. The course is popular and both

tournaments attracted a large number of people who were able to enjoy the course while being appropriately distanced from each other.

The bears have unfortunately discovered the new location for the dumpsters is very convenient for them and have been having regular parties. Bear proof lids will be ordered as well as using a variety of bleach and ammonia to try to discourage them.

The recycle program at the fire station has been doing well. The last run produced almost \$500. The Chief had asked MVFA to cover most of the cost of new badges for the firefighters, with this last recycle income the board agreed to cover the entire cost.

There will be lots of projects to do out at Finnon this fall and winter. All work is done by volunteers and more are always welcome. SCPOA Report

This is the August and September report due to the date change of the August meeting. The August meeting was changed to a later date in hopes of getting current financial reports. Treasurer, David Blain, expressed frustration in the inability of the management company to provide current financial information as well as their inability to send out the annual financial review within the required time. The board requested a solution for these problems going forward. September financial information was finally current. There is a surplus this year so far of just over \$40K due to several factors including decreased payroll, no use of contingency funds and not having to pay for grant. David is still recommending returning to the members the excess at the end of the year.

The new mower and trailer were picked up and have been in use and Kevin has done over 300 hours of chipping including cleanup on Dogwood. The EID water that has been used to keep the water level at Dyer up has been turned off, about 3 million gallons of water was added over the summer. The first spraying of the roads will occur in October, signs have been purchased that are large enough to read and will be posted at all entrances to roads to be sprayed. The date will also be posted on social media when known.

The grant for clearing brush and trees has been completed with almost \$500K in in kind work done. Several more grants are being looked at in hopes of making this a fire wise community. Several projects were suggested for the common areas including additional picnic table at Trout Lake, bench by horseshoe pits and additional white fencing at Trout Lake. The board approved an additional \$3k to complete the fencing along Mosquito at Trout Lake.

Our new fire Chief Jack Rosevear asked if the board would consider a donation to purchase AED's (automatic defibrillators) which would be placed in each vehicle at the department. The pilots group was committed to purchase one, Tom Best made the motion and all were in favor of board using the annual donation to the department to purchase the rest of the needed units. All units had arrived by the September meeting and are currently in each vehicle.

Recipe of the Month Pumpkin Soup

Let's get in the Halloween/Fall spirit and make some yummy soup for those chilly nights ahead.

INGREDIENTS:

1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil 4 c. low-sodium chicken broth

1 large onion, coarsely chopped Kosher salt

4 cloves garlic, minced Freshly ground black pepper

4 lb. pumpkin (any kind but preferably 1/2 c. heavy cream, plus more for garnish

sugar pie)

DIRECTIONS:

1. In a heavy soup pot or Dutch oven over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion and garlic and cook until golden.

- 2. Meanwhile, halve, peel, and scrape out seeds of the pumpkin. Cut into chunks.
- 3. Add pumpkin chunks and broth to pot. Season with salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, uncovered, and then reduce heat to a simmer. Simmer until pumpkin is fork-tender, about 30 minutes.
- 4. Remove pot from heat and, using an immersion blender, blend mixture until smooth. (Alternatively, let soup cool, then blend in a blender.) Stir in cream and season to taste.
- 5. To serve, ladle soup into bowls, add a swirl of cream, and garnish with pepper.






