#### **National Fire Prevention Week**

October is a wonderful month and we witness Mother Nature's grand changes as she prepares for her winter slumber. These changes are seen in the glorious colors of fall, and the final harvest of the year. We set out decorations to scare the little ghouls and goblins whom on Halloween night will be running throughout our streets trick or treating (or attending the Trunk 'r' Treat on 10/29!).

We also look to October for Fire Prevention Week. This year, Fire Prevention Week is Sunday, October 9<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, October 16<sup>th</sup>.

In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge was the first American President to proclaim a national recognition of Fire Prevention Week. In our modern era, the National Fire Protection Association is its sponsor.\*

National Fire Prevention Week actually has roots that date back to the Great Chicago Fire, where it is rumored that Mrs. O'Leary's cow kicked over a lantern burning down much of the Windy City. In 1911, in commemoration of the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of that fateful day, the National Fire Marshals Association sponsored the first Fire Prevention Week.\*

Fire Prevention on "The Hill" holds great importance, as we balance fire prevention in the wildland interface and in our homes. This is the time where we should start the building of defensible space by clearing brush back from our homes to at least 200 feet, and removing dead trees and ladder fuels from our property. We should clear the pine needles off our roofs, clear out our attics, decrease the clutter in our yards and ensure that our driveways allow access for emergency vehicles. We should have our chimneys inspected and cleaned, check our heating systems to ensure they are in proper working order, including changing filters. We should also make sure that we change the batteries in our smoke and carbon dioxide detectors.

The members of the Mosquito Fire Protection District are here to assist you with any questions or concerns regarding fire prevention and we will be more than happy to do a home inspection, to assist you in identifying your fire prevention needs. ### <u>Don't Bother Me, I've Paid My HOA Dues!</u> By Roger Stenbock, President SCPOA

In Swansboro, we live amongst more than one thousand other community members, yet a mere handful show up at our monthly board meetings. So the board receives input from only a very few dedicated members and we thank them. However, I believe we can do better. Many of you can probably relate to the following statement: "I pay my dues, which is all I am required to do, so don't bother me with newsletter articles about getting involved or lecture me about my obligation to participate in committees, serve on the board or attend meetings. If there is something wrong, I will make my opinion known. Until then, leave me alone!"

Fortunately, not all owners feel that way, but it is a sentiment that is shared by many owners who, if they thought about it a little, could contribute much to the betterment of our community.

Suppose you invest \$300,000 with a brokerage firm whose responsibility to you is to do everything possible to preserve and grow that investment. The only responsibility you have is to pay their transaction fees. However, during the course of your relationship with this firm, they continually plead with you to take a more active role to learn what your money is doing and how to best invest it. Would your attitude be the same towards your brokerage firm as it is towards your association?

Probably not. The successful investor wants to know everything about their investments and will gladly read everything sent to them about the status of their investment in hopes of learning something that will help make them more successful.

In reality, the attitudes about your community association should be no different. Both are charged with preserving, maintaining and enhancing your investment. The only difference is that the investment that your community association is protecting is your home. Our attitudes about our home can be much more emotional and our attachments much different from our attitudes and attachments about our money (although, ultimately they are one and the same). Our home is our castle and the owner is king of the castle. Anyone who dares to tell the king what to do and how to behave outside of the castle, and get involved, is perceived as a meddler and threat to the quality of their life. Our money, on the other hand, is a tool used in order to make more money.

Let's challenge the thinking that rationalizes our non-participation by remembering that involvement is not solicited in order to intrude upon our lives and lay siege to our castle. Participation is needed to contribute to the betterment of our community and improve the quality of life for everyone in it. Every member of our community has knowledge, skills and experience that our association and your board would love to access. Consider the desire to be a successful community member with the same passion that you would desire to be a successful investor. Transcend the 'I' 'me' and 'mine' thinking that keeps us from sharing our time and energy with our association, to moving toward a consciousness of our entire community's needs and opportunities, resulting in 'we' 'us' and 'our' thinking. This leads to involvement, support and cooperation, and guarantees an improvement in everyone's life.

#### Here are a few ways to help our community:

Attend meetings. Don't just attend only to vent a problem or complaint. Accept a nomination to serve on the Board or appointment to a committee. Be prepared when asked to contribute; plan details of an event, coordinate with other owners and friends. Contribute whatever time you have available for the benefit of the community. Become a dependable, constructive member of the association.

Keep an open mind and look for the benefits to the community whenever a new program is being initiated. While our professional management firm does many of the difficult day-to-day administrative tasks, it is under the scrutiny of your board. However, the directors, officers and committee members are all volunteers, so don't be overly critical.

When attending Board meetings, remember that the only time you should address the Board is during the open forum session. Don't interrupt during the business meeting. Read your newsletter and correspondence from the management company. Introduce yourself to new owners. Let them know that our community is a great place to live and that you look forward to their involvement. I hope to see you at our next board meeting.
