The ABC's of Drowning Prevention

Drowning is the main cause of death for El Dorado County toddlers and preschoolers. In El Dorado County, 70% of drowning deaths occur in children under the age of five. In California, every year, 75 families lose a child under the age of five to drowning. That is three empty classes of kindergartners. Help protect your children from these preventable tragedies. Learn the ABCs of drowning prevention. Your child's life depends on it.

Home Water Hazards

Each year many young children drown in swimming pools, other bodies of water, and standing water around the home:

- · Hot tubs, spas and whirlpools
- Bathtubs, even with baby bathtub "supporting ring" devices
- Backyard kiddie pools, ponds and water fountains
- Buckets and pails, especially 5-gallon buckets and diaper pails
- Toilets
- Irrigation ditches, post holes and wells

Children must be watched by an adult at all times when in or near water. Children may drown in an inch or two of water. Stay within an arm's length of your child.

The ABC's of Drowning Prevention

A for Adult Supervision

- Adult supervision is key to drowning prevention. Always assign a "water watcher" who knows how to swim.
- Provide active adult supervision 100% of the time when children are in or near the water. Do not drink alcohol while supervising children.
- Children under 5 should be kept within arm's reach while in water.
- Water wings, noodles, inner tubes and life jackets should never take the place of adult supervision for children ages 0-5.
- Know where your children are at all times. 69% of children who drowned in swimming pools were not supposed to be in or around the water. If a child is missing, check the pool first.

B for Barriers

- Put in, check, and always use a childproof barrier around your pool/spa area.
- The only proven effective barrier is a 5-foot-tall non-climbable fence with self-closing, self-latching gates that separates the pool from the house and yard.
- Remove toys from, in, or around the pool area they pull young children to the pool.
- Keep chairs, tables and other climbable items away from the pool barrier.

C for CPR & Classes

• Learn CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and rescue breathing.

- Call 911. Start CPR and rescue breathing at pool side. This can save a life while the ambulance is on the way.
- Make sure all children and adults in your family go to swim lessons and water safety training. However, remember these classes do not take the place of the need for adult supervision and barriers.
- To find swimming classes ask at a local community pool, family resource center, or parks and recreation district locations.
- To find CPR classes contact your local Red Cross chapter, family resource center, or American Heart Association.

Finnon Lake Recreation Area

The MVFA Board of Directors is responsible for finding ways to pay the costs of keeping Finnon Lake Recreation area and the café open, operating safely and always improving. The MVFA Board alone is responsible for park maintenance and payments of more than \$10,000 in annual bills to keep the park open to the public. MVFA is entirely self-supporting. It receives no money from the Fire Department (MFPD), other tax source, or the Swansboro Homeowners Association (SCPOA).

The MVFA budget is public information. The budget is discussed, and copies are available at each board meeting. If you have any questions about MVFA, please attend the MVFA Board of Directors meeting on the first Thursday of each month at the fire station. Also, Fish and Wildlife Committee Chair Dave Angelo or Campground & Property Committee Chair Tom Harris can be reached by phone or email at: mvfa95667@gmail.com.

There is a \$6.00 Day Use fee for day use activities: swimming, fishing, boating (including inflatables), and disc golf. This fee is no more than other private parks charge for similar activities. Hiking, bird watching and bicycling at Finnon are free of charge. Every dollar collected from park fees and donations goes back into improving the site. MVFA has no paid employees; everyone who gives their time is a volunteer. MVFA offers an annual Day Use Pass for Mosquito Fire District residents. Contact Dave Angelo at 621-3688 to purchase the Resident Day Use Pass.

MVFA holds most of its community events at Finnon Lake, including the Easter Egg Hunt and Halloween Trunk or Treat. Mosquito residents are encouraged to consider Finnon Lake when planning family events, church outings, or club campouts. Finnon Lake Recreation Area is open all year. Click on the "Camping" page of our website at www.finnonrecreationarea.com to check the reservations calendar for availability and to make reservations on-line. Finnon Lake Recreation Area has progressed a long way since our dam was condemned a number of years ago, and the decision was made to reconstruct it. Most of the costs of the Dam Reconstruction Project were paid by grants from private conservation organizations and state grants set aside for wildlife and wetland preservation, thanks to the efforts of Mark Egbert and the Resource Conservation District. Now that the dam project is complete, MVFA must comply with the requirements of these grants, which call primarily for fish and wildlife protection and monitoring to ensure the health of the habitat for years to come.

Other projects as well as maintenance work will continue at Finnon Lake under the MVFA Campground and Property Committee and the Fish and Wildlife Committee. Future projects include improvements to the campground bathrooms, development of the beach/swim area, a group camp site, and improvements to the cafe gardens and pavilion area. We will continue to have our annual Campground Cleanup Day late in the spring. Volunteers are always welcome. Many thanks go to Jan Okumura and friends for their ongoing volunteer work and contributions to the cafe gardens. Thanks go out to the many volunteers who helped build, improve and maintain the park over the years. MVFA continues the work that was begun years ago. Resolving Neighbor Complaints By Roger Stenbock, SCPOA President

Although we live amongst the serene and bucolic foothills of the Sierra Mountains, with plenty of room, we still have neighbors. 99% of the time they are our friends, and we get along really well. But then, there is always an exception.

Your First Course of Action

The Swansboro HOA does not have a police department and can only deal with DC&R violations in a very limited way. So, generally before calling 911 to complain about a barking dog, it's much better to start with a more reasonable approach. One of the first things to do is talk with your neighbor about the situation. Amazingly, some folks aren't even aware they're being a nuisance. Schedule a friendly face-to-face meeting and calmly tell them about what bothers you.

Sometimes your neighbor just doesn't want to listen and accommodate you, and it is time to put pen to paper. The Swansboro website http://www.scpoa.net contains a simple complaint form. The instructions are straightforward, and your information is kept confidential. First, check to see if you really have a valid complaint. Ask yourself is it a noise, property line, dog dispute or even some parked clunker issue? Then get a copy of your local El Dorado County ordinances and the SCPOA bylaws and DC&Rs to see if they cover these issues. They clearly state what is and isn't acceptable in the community. Make a copy and provide it to your neighbor explaining that you would like to resolve things without going to the authorities.

Your Next Step

Is their music still keeping you up all night? It is quite common for a neighbor to retaliate by either ignoring you or even turning the volume up a bit. Well, now, it may be time to call the police. The police will often respond to noise complaints and remind the offending person about the same noise ordinances mentioned earlier. However, if things have gotten bad enough to call the police, it may be time to ask for mediation. Mediation is often cheaper and less threatening than going to court. Again, you may want to look to your homeowner's association. The Swansboro board may call a hearing for you and your neighbor to state your cases. Or most cities offer free or low cost mediation services which can find an impartial professional to sit down with you and your neighbor. They will help you come to your own compromise. Some will even spare you the pain of calling your neighbor by setting up the time and place of the mediation.

Still No Progress

By this time, most rational people will have found a way to peacefully co-exist. But you may live down the street or next door to someone who's unusually difficult. In this case, small claims court may be a viable option. It will help you get their attention and maybe even a little money.

One More Thing

Whether you are leasing or buying, most states say you are entitled to something called the "quiet or peaceful enjoyment" of your home. You can sue them for nuisance if their noise or other activities interfere with your enjoyment of your property. In the lawsuit, you can ask for compensation for the loss of this enjoyment. The idea of losing money should be enough to give even the toughest neighbor pause.


