CHIEF'S REPORT

Calls for Service: July 25th - August 21st

Vegetation Fire- 1 (Assist Garden Valley- Strike Team to Nevada

County)

Medical Aid- 2 Public Assist: 5

On Wednesday August 16th, Firefighter Cole Caudle was assigned to Garden Valley Engine 351, as a part of a strike team which responded 'immediate need' to the Highway Fire in Nevada County. For a time, fire threatened the town of Washington. The combined efforts of firefighters averted structure loss and the strike team participated in strengthening containment lines. On Saturday August 19th, Firefighter Caudle was relieved by a Garden Valley firefighter and the strike team reassigned to lightning fires in Northern California. We appreciate the relationships we have with our neighboring districts, to help and support one another.

Captain Moore and I participated in meetings/tours with County DOT, Shimmick Construction and County Fire to plan and prepare for emergencies at the bridge construction area and the concrete batch plant. We are forming response plans to deal with incidents, working cooperatively with County Fire and Shimmick to assure we provide the best possible coordination to save lives and property.

Tony Christensen and Trevor Dillender will start EMT academy in September, graduating in December. We are expecting to also send personnel to Firefighter 1 academy in the Spring.

OES Engine 4312 and Water Tender 75 are repaired and are back in service.

TSU Tree Service will be doing a major tree removal operation for PG&E in September. They will utilize our parking area for vehicle staging during the project, which will last approximately one month. They have completed our Temporary Use Form and agreement, which has been reviewed and approved by CIRA. The District will be compensated \$1,200 plus a transfer load of gravel for the grading of our parking area, in preparation for the winter months. I will assure, along with the TSU manager, that there will be no obstruction to our fueling area and designated parking for District business.

Fire Season 2023 dangerous burning conditions are upon us, after a late Spring delays. As the weather improves, increased caution must be taken with outside burning.

If residents find it necessary to cut weeds/grass/vegetation, do it in the cooler morning hours before noon and never when it is windy.

Remember to practice evacuation procedures and always be aware of two escape routes. It's easy to get cut off during an actual incident.

Our Fire District staff is fully committed to our Community. We stand ready to assist our residents with any needs they may have, to prepare, support and provide the most up to date information. We are happy to conduct an interior or exterior fire safety inspection upon your request. Please call us at 530-626-9017 or stop by the station.

CAPMPGROUND UPDATE

Camping has slowed down a little now that school has started. We had an extremely busy summer and some of June and most of July is already booked for next year. We are very grateful to all the returning campers we get each year. Everyone comments on how much they enjoy the peaceful serene place we have here. We are still looking forward to a couple disc golf tournaments yet this year, along with two more scout troops coming before we close in November. We have almost doubled up on our full campground bookings from last year and every one of those groups have already booked for next year.



DISK GOLF COURSE UPGRADES

Over the past year the MVFA volunteers have been busy making some significant improvements to the Finnon Disc Golf Course. With the availability of waste concrete from the Shimmick batch plant located on Finnon property, the volunteers have created 16 concrete tee pads to replace the rubber mats previously in use. The rubber mats will be relocated closer to the golf holes to accommodate younger disc golfers. The volunteers will continue to create pads over the next year to complete the 27 holes on the course. In addition to the tee pads, the MVFA board reviewed the condition of the four original vault toilets which were constructed by the State when they owned the campground. The condition of the toilets were at a point at which the units would need to be totally abandoned and eventually torn down, or restored to their original condition. The Board elected to restore the units and the first of the four has been nearly completed. The remaining three units will be restored over the next two years.
