MFPD SUPPORT GROUP UPDATE

Support Group In Review

The Support Group was established to perform those duties often associated with a fire emergency response which do not require the training and skill level of a certified firefighter. The Group operates under the general direction of the Fire Chief, however, during an emergency response the Group is generally supervised by the Station Manager and Incident Commander.

A Support Group volunteer's duties may include:

- Emergency Evacuation Coordination – manage the evacuation of residents and/or the staging of evacuees at the airport for temporary refuge,
- Road Control - road closures or traffic direction during emergency incidents,
- Water Supply - operating a mobile water pump or controlling the flow of water from a fire hydrant,
- Helispot Coordination - provide verbal assistance to a helicopter during landing when being used in an emergency incident,
- Medical Assistance – aid medical staff with equipment delivery and record keeping,
- Firefighter Rehabilitation - ensure that firefighter personnel who might be suffering the effects of heat/cold stress, dehydration, physical exertion and/or extreme weather receive evaluation and rehabilitation during training and emergency operations,
- Logistical Support – transporting firefighters, equipment, food and/or water to the scene of an emergency incident and other duties as may be assigned by the Chief or Station Manager during an emergency incident.

Occasionally, and when assigned by the Chief, the Support Group may also assist the career staff with fire prevention duties, perform public education functions and assist in the District's Administrative Office.

Following is a summary of the support provided to the district this past year.

Support Group Members:

- ▶ Currently 28 team members
- ▶ Over 133 collective years of experience
- ▶ An average of 4.75 years of experience per member

Support Group 2024 Stats:

- ▶ Responded to 113 Incidents
 - 82 Medical
 - 15 Fire
 - 8 Traffic Control
 - 8 Assist
- ▶ Over 606 manhours of incident response (not including the Crozier fire)
- ▶ Crozier Fire – 754 manhours
- ▶ Over 420 manhours of training
- ▶ Over 96 manhours of general department support



The Support Group is an integral part of the emergency response capability for the Mosquito community, freeing firefighters to focus on primary fire suppression and/or medical treatment.

MVFA Campground News

Here are the camping stats from HIPCAMP for the Finnon Lake Recreation Area Campground for the year.

- We had a total of 1,270 bookings on HIPCAMP.
- We had 2,473 nights hosted, with each booking lasting 2.0 nights on average.
- We had 3,483 campers stay with us.
- We had 207 new camper reviews in 2024.
- With an average booking value of \$47, we earned \$60,258 this year. That put us in the top 10% of Hosts on HIPCAMP!
- We directly hosted nine full campground bookings at a value of \$7,170.



We are looking forward to another robust and successful camping season when we open this spring!

MVFA Board Membership

The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association was formed as a result of the formation of the fire protection districts. The MVFA which was originally the volunteer fire department had its roots in volunteerism and community fire protection. If an adequate number of nominees who represent these two categories do not fill the available open positions, then nominees of the MVFA general membership are candidates for selection through the voting process.
