fire pits and cook grills to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience. Additionally, the following guidelines are in place to ensure the safety and comfort of all visitors:

- **Quiet Hours**: Quiet hours are enforced from 10:00 PM to 7:00 AM to maintain a peaceful environment for all campers.
- Fire Safety: Campfires are allowed in designated fire pits unless deemed unsafe by Cal Fire. Campers must ensure that fires are completely extinguished before leaving their site.
- **Respect for Wildlife**: Visitors are advised not to feed or approach wildlife, including the resident bald eagles. Drones are also prohibited to avoid disturbing the natural habitat.

Season Opening

We are getting ready for another season of camping and will officially open on Tuesday April 1. During the month of March, we will be doing the last- minute touch up of the campground. The last couple rain storms have brought down several branches and the warm weather has started the grass growing. We are excited about the upcoming camping season. We are already booked most weekends and have several full campground bookings. Most of those full bookings are repeat families that love our campground and use if for their family vacations. Finnon is a great place to camp.

How to Make Reservations

Reservations for camping at Finnon Lake Recreation Area can be made through the HipCamp website. Campers are encouraged to book their sites well in advance, as the campground is often sold-out months ahead. Check-in is at 2:00 PM, and check-out is at 11:00 AM.
