The primary purpose of this report is to keep the community informed as to the activities and progress on major programs or objectives and to seek community feedback about how we may best serve you. Personnel:

We are currently accepting applications for Fire Captain. Though we have received many applications there are three outstanding candidates that will be moving on to the next phase of the hiring process. The application period will remain open until the position is filled, with the first round of applicants beginning their evaluation process next week.

To provide complete objectivity, we will utilize an independent panel made up of experienced Fire Company Officers from agencies here in El Dorado County. They will assess the candidates on leadership, requisite knowledge required of a company officer, with the ability to manage emergency incidents from the very basic to more complex. The panel will rank each candidate, then provide my office with their findings.

Recruitment and Retention

We have recruited one new Firefighter in February. Please welcome Hayden Railsback to the Fire District. Hayden has considerable EMS and Fire experience

Department Training and Safety:

We will be publishing a training calendar for upcoming training here in the district and training opportunities available to all Fire/Support Group Personnel.

Logistics:

The El Dorado County Emergency Services Authority, has donated to the Fire District a ZOLL M Series Cardiac Monitor, which will be utilized when we deploy the REMS Team, or a Fire Line Medic. We will also be receiving a donation of used BK Radios from the JPA.

Interlocal:

I have had conversations with County Supervisor Lori Parlin, CAO Sue Henneke, LAFFCO MSR Committee on the financial sustainability of this Fire District, and the impacts of the county's decision to end Aid to Fire Funding in 2017. No promises were made. Supervisor Parlin has a greater understanding of the financial impacts created by that decision. I pointed out that less than 1% of the County's overall \$400,000,000 budget will completely fund all rural fire districts to provide staffing necessary to ensure the safety of community residents. This certainly was not lost in translation.

Chief Brown

It needs to be understood that Chief Brown did with all due diligence complete his report,

Report:

making his recommendations to our Board of Directors. We have the report, and it is available to anyone who wishes to read it.

We have not completed the payments to Georgetown Fire for this work. The initial cost was to be \$3,000 monthly for a total of \$9,000, however members of our board requested that Chief Brown revisit and revise and amend his report. The original contract was for a 3-month study, this request extended the study by a month, increasing the overall cost by \$3,000. We currently owe Georgetown Fire \$6,000

Legislative: The California Fire Chiefs Association is working with CALOSHA and FEDOSH, to identify compromises on potential regulatory changes being recommended by committee, which could severely impact small rural Fire Agencies with unsustainable costs, which could easily bankrupt rural fire departments.

Grants: Our 50/50 CALFIRE Grant has been submitted

Apparatus: All Fire Apparatus were inspected by Jason Warden of Stretchfab Truck Repairs. All of our Firefighting assets are capable of operating as necessary in the event of emergency for which they are designed. Over the years, our apparatus have fallen into serious neglect, now requiring considerable maintenance repairs.

Engine 75- \$21,000 Waiting on the completion of Engine 275 repairs

Engine 275-\$15,000 currently in the shop undergoing repairs.

Expedition 7500- came in under cost, at \$1400

Expedition Vin/Lic# 1417356 repairs came in under cost at \$600.

Explorer Vin/Lic #2ZB74411 has been surplused, the vehicle will be removed from our inventory, and taken off our insurance.

REMS/Line EMT-Medic:

We recently had 3 of our members complete a series of courses qualifying them to deploy as single resource Line EMTs. This will allow us to send personnel out on deployment when we cannot send Fire Assets, increasing their annual income without impacting the Fire District Budget, also bringing back to the district, reimbursement for vehicle and equipment rentals along with a 28% admin fee.

Verizon has received a permit and approval to move forward with the construction of a cell tower on Stope Drive. We are in discussion with Verizon to obtain funding for the purchase of rescue equipment necessary to support the construction of such elevated infrastructure.

Public Safety and Training:

Please remember to clean your chimney, be prepared for any type of emergency and evacuation.

Support Group Training:

Monthly Training on the first Saturday of each month.


Rainbow Trout Stocking at Finnon Lake Reservoir

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) carried out a fish stocking event at Finnon Lake Reservoir on Wednesday March 26th. Resource agent David Ford delivered over 500 pounds of rainbow trout, approximately 300 fish in total.

This stocking event is part of CDFW's ongoing efforts to enhance recreational fishing opportunities and maintain healthy fish populations in California's waterways. Finnon

Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has launched an innovative new program called the California Inland Recreational Angler Survey (CIRAS). This web-based platform is designed to gather valuable data from anglers about their fishing trips, providing immediate access to aggregated sport fishing data through an interactive "Ready to



Fish" dashboard. CIRAS is a crowdsourcing platform that allows anglers to submit information about their fishing experiences. This data includes details about the species caught, catch rates, size distributions, and the time of year when fish are most active. The platform aims to give anglers a user-friendly experience while contributing to scientific research and helping CDFW better manage California's fisheries. Anglers can access data submitted by others, helping them plan their next fishing trip more effectively.

The platform is currently available for waters within CDFW's North Central Region. Finnon Reservoir is a listed location in the CIRAS app, so please document your fishing experience online when fishing at Finnon Reservoir.

We hope to see you at Finnon Lake soon, and happy fishing!



Finnon Recreation Area Day Use Annual Pass

In accord with the changes made by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife in 2023, the MVFA issues 365-day Finnon Lake Recreation Area Day Use Annual Passes. Prior to the 2023 change, the MVFA issued a calendar-based annual day use pass that expired on Dec. 31, regardless of when it was issued. This change has made it fairer to individuals who purchase a pass later in the year.

The annual pass fees for 2025 remain unchanged with the single year annual pass costing \$50, a two-year pass costing \$75 and a five-year pass for \$150. If you are interested in obtaining a 1 year, 2 year or 5 year day use pass, please contact the MVFA at MVFA95667@GMAIL.COM or by calling (530) 409-5515.

As a reminder the Finnon Lake Recreation Area is not located within the Swansboro Property Owners Association and for the day use of activities such as fishing, boating, picnicking, swimming, and disc golf a daily fee or annual pass is required. The daily Day Use fee is \$6.00 for individuals or groups of up to six persons and is submitted at the main entrance to the park. Fees are collected on the honor system. There is no charge for trail walkers and there is no additional charge to registered campers for any Day Use activity. The Day Use area closes at dark.

Finnon Lake Notice to Pet Owners

With the onset of warmer weather, we remind visitors to Finnon Lake that the lake is not chemically treated. See the notice below which is posted on the El Dorado County Animal Services website.

Be Careful with Your Pet Near Lakes, Rivers, and Ponds - Animal Services is reminding residents to use caution when recreating at lakes, rivers, or ponds where potentially dangerous algae may be present. To avoid possible cyanobacterial toxin poisoning, practice safe water habits. Dogs can be especially susceptible when algal mats are present. Do not let your dog drink water or enter water where patches of algae are present, or to eat scum or algal material. Wash your pets with clean water after lake or river play. Provide clean drinking water.
