We're deeply grateful for the continued support of our readers. Your subscriptions make it possible to keep this long-standing tradition alive and thriving for the Mosquito community.

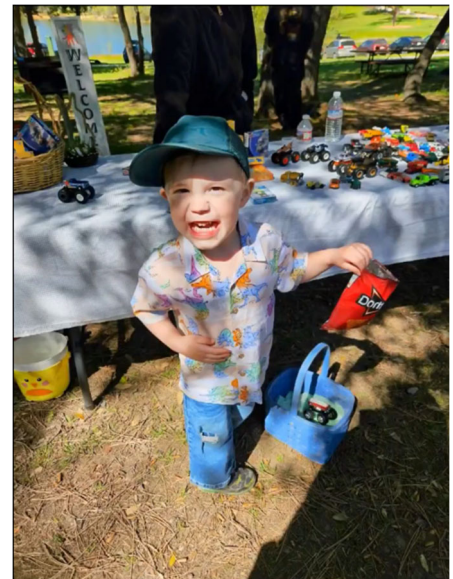

EXPLORE THE LOST GOLD RUSH TOWN OF NELSONVILLE THIS MEMORIAL DAY

Here's a timely reminder to mark your calendars for one of the most intriguing events of the season — a deep look into the remarkable and often forgotten history of our area.

This year's presentation, led by **local historian Steve Vrael**, will shine a spotlight on **Nelsonville**, a once-thriving Gold Rush town located along Mosquito Cut Off. Nelsonville flourished with businesses typical of the era — including several saloons that served as social hubs, complete with the “dancing girls” who were a staple of Old West entertainment. Far from the Hollywood caricatures, these women played a complex and often misunderstood role in frontier communities. Their lives,



their work, and even the tragic fire which reportedly

claimed several of them — still resting in unmarked graves in the Nelsonville Cemetery — form a compelling chapter of local history that few residents know.

These stories, along with many others about the people and places that shaped early Mosquito, will be explored during this special Memorial Day event.

BIRDING AT FINNON LAKE

March brought a lively mix of early-spring bird activity to the Mosquito area, with both familiar residents and seasonal visitors making appearances around Finnon Lake and the surrounding hills. As the days warmed and the first hints of green returned, our observers recorded a diverse list of species. Everything from waterfowl to woodpeckers, raptors, and the first bright flashes of migrating songbirds.

Waterbirds were well-represented this month, including **Canada Geese, Mallards, American Coots, Pied-billed Grebes**, and a small group of **Double-crested Cormorants**. A lone **Great Egret** added a touch of elegance to the shoreline, while our two **Bald Eagles** continued to be a highlight for many watchers.

Woodpeckers remained active, with **Acorn Woodpeckers, Northern Flickers**, and a single **White-breasted Nuthatch** making the list. Songbirds brought color and movement to the trees and shrubs, including **Ruby-crowned Kinglets, American Robins, Lesser Goldfinches, Dark-eyed Juncos**, and a bright **Orange-crowned Warbler**—a welcome sign of spring migration.

Ravens, jays, and titmice rounded out the sightings, along with a notable showing of blackbirds: **20 Red-winged Blackbirds** and **4 Great-tailed Grackles**, both adding their distinctive calls to the soundscape.

EL DORADO COUNTY CIVIL GRAND JURY OPENINGS

The El Dorado County Civil Grand Jury has opened the Application process for the 2026-2027 Grand Jury.

The Civil Grand Jury functions as a watchdog over local government operations to determine if local government can be made more efficient and effective. They are empowered to examine any aspect of county government, city government, and special districts including schools. In addition, they review and may inquire into citizen complaints.

The term is one year (July - June) and requires* a minimum of 8 hrs/wk participation. Usually all members attend a weekly plenary meeting and selected Committee Meetings that are topic specific. Grand Jurors are reimbursed for mileage and receive a \$15/day stipend.s

Desirable Qualities: Have sufficient time and commitment, be in good health, ability to work with others, open minded and respectful of the views of others, have a genuine interest in community affairs, possess basic investigative skills, and ability to use a computer and write reports.

Prior to the commencement of the term, all newly sworn members receive a two day orientation and training, typically in late June.
