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Background

This program started following a conversation with a Year 11 student about her career interests.

She, like many others, have a great system at school to help guide in understanding careers on offer but have little insight to the first-hand experience and cultures of these career choices.

As we talked further, I realised there was limited understanding of what different roles and professions actually meant - what the jobs entailed and what their longer term future opportunities might be – a landscape of opportunities and exploration.

It was at this point we decided to do something about this.

Notwithstanding the fact that these young Australians will find their own destinies and follow their own paths, if I had been able to get just a small glimpse of what it would be like to be a lawyer, accountant, retail manager, small business owner, marketing professional, educator, banker, management consultant, etc., I would have gained a better insight to those professions, maybe had the chance to have some hands on experience, and connect with successful professionals in that field who may be able to mentor me on my journey.

The world would have appeared to be my oyster.

And that's how The International Oyster Program began.

With the good fortune of being connected with incredibly amazing people in their fields of work, we wanted to explore more about their journeys - what they do, how they got there, what's it like, and what tips would they have for year 11, year 12 and university students.

Within the first couple of days of reaching out to share the idea, over 40 eager supporters put their hands up to give up ½ hour of their time for an interview that could be shared with young people. It seems the passion to provide support to our future generations is almost another global pandemic!

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Our Approach

1. Goal

We realised everyone has incredibly busy lives and volunteering to donate time is always at the cost of something else. Our was to minimise the time and effort required from our supporters whilst maximising the insights and impact for our audiences. Therefore, we prepared a step by step approach so that volunteers could see the entire program and where they will be contributing.

2. Creation of a survey

We collected data to help compile a survey and invite our students to put forward their burning questions. These questions were compiled, structured, and then shared with each volunteer relative to their industry and role in a survey response.

3. Gathering information on volunteers

We ask our supporters to please complete the attached form which will provide a backdrop and introduction about you. This will also include an introduction to be used in the interview. This should be between 1-3 paragraphs – tips are provided in the form.

4. Prepare for the Interview

We compiled questions for the interview and share these with you, at which time we can agree a convenient time to run the interview. All interviews will be digitally conducted over 'zoom'.

5. The Interview

This will run for no more than 30 minutes and will be recorded. The recording will be used by Braintree and Future of Aus in the International Oyster Program for the audience to view, receive an audio, and/or transcript of the interview.

6. Subsequent steps

You may be requested by a student for an introduction for a more detailed discussion. Please indicate if you are prepared to offer any follow up conversations or mentoring for eager young students.
