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well-adjusted, attractive, easy-going, loving, truthful, social, a leader, a hard worker, practical, and kind. She is currently a college student. She was reported to have no enotional or behavioral difficulties and had no delinquent involvement. Ms. Lockett reported that the has no history of alcohol or drug abuse. Ms. Lockett believes that the hard and Anne have a close relationship. It is Anne's full sister.

Anne's family lives in a house in a middle-class neighborhood where their living quarters were said to be large and spacious. Anne has lived at the present location for most of her life. During her life, Anne has lived in four different locations. According to Ms. Lockett, the family is having some trouble making ends meet. The family was identified as being protestant, but never attends services.

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION

Affective and cognitive difficulties indicated by Ms. Lockett include boredom, forgetfulness, moodiness, and a lack of self-confidence. The mother noted that Anne is significantly depressed, but reported that she rarely shows emotions by crying. In spite of this report of depression, Anne never talks of suicide, but has attempted suicide several times. Her last attempt occurred within the past month.

There are few indications that Anne's thought processes may have become compromised. Her mother reported that Anne is often lost in her own thoughts and has been somewhat suspicious of the motives of other people.

Behavioral problems reported by Ms. Lockett included little or no respect for authority, frequent externalization of blame, delinquency, and dishonesty. She was described as being seldom impulsive and her mother reported that she can sometimes use good judgement. Ms. Lockett revealed that Anne sometimes accepts and sometimes rejects the rule of authority. Her mother reported that she appears tired much of the time.

Ms. Lockett reported that Anne has friendship patterns that are fairly typical of most adolescents and she enjoys some socializing;

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
