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but also values time by herself. Interpersonal difficulties have included loneliness and occasional sensitivity to criticism. According to Anne's mother, she has some infrequent difficulty controlling angry feelings. It is her impression that Anne sometimes feels misunderstood by those around her.

Anne's mother indicated that she is typically easy to live with. Ms. Lockett reported that she generally disapproves of the friends that Anne has selected. She indicated that Anne has never thought of running away from home.

School-related difficulties were said to include homework completion and erratic relationships with teachers. Anne was reported to be having academic problems.

Ms. Lockett believes that Anne smokes cigarettes on a regular basis and noted that she has been allowed to drink at home on occasion. Anne uses marijuana on a daily basis. To the best of Ms. Lockett's knowledge, Anne commonly uses hard drugs. Anne was not reported to have ever tried inhalants or cocaine.
