ADMISSION AND REFERRAL DATA

The subject is a 17 year old white female who was admitted to Forest Hospital on 9/11/92 following an evaluation by Tammi Brown, LCSW of the Youth Diagnostic Center. This is the subject's first psychiatric hospitalization although according to her, she has attempted suicide four times in the past. The most recent gesture was about two weeks prior to hospitalization. The admission report stated that the subject abused a variety of mood altering drugs, had become isolative and withdrawn, associated with negative peers, was poorly motivated and was doing poorly in school. She has had some experience with outpatient counseling, however reported that therapy terminated at her father's request.

MENTAL STATUS AND BEHAVIORAL OBSERVATIONS

The 5'3", 155 lb female initially was hostile and oppositional. However, as the procedure continued rapport was established. She is a very insecure, depressed, needy young adult. Her defense against being hurt is to be abrasive, abusive and rude in order to distance people. These behaviors mask a very lonely, sad, isolated person.

During the procedure performance was inconsistent. The subject has problems with attention, memory and concentration as well as verbal and nonverbal abilities. Judgement, reasoning, problem solving and common sense are poor. There is evidence of organicity probably due to extensive use of mood altering substances. Many of the attitudes and behaviors

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
