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St. Isaac Jogues is one of eight French missionaries who preached the Gospel to Huron and Iroquois Indians in the U.S. and Canada. We remember them as the North American Martyrs. They suffered and were martyred in the mid 1600’s. St. Isaac Jogues stands out. Even after losing the use of his hands, he blessed people and worked for peace. Notice the image and names of the Martyrs and symbols reflecting Jesuit crosses and Indian dwellings in front. Parish beams reflect wampum belts, and red colors reflect the blood of Martyrs.
