Field Board

-Turnout in a maintained pasture with run-in shed(s). Pasture will be shared with other horses. Field placement is not guaranteed and may change due to horse temperaments or pasture maintenance routines.

-Nutrena Safe Choice Grain (maintenance or senior) fed twice daily in the field (fence or ground feeder). Specialty grain other than what we provide shall be purchased by the boarder.

-Supplements or medications (purchased by boarder) fed as directed with grain.

-Hay fed in pasture twice daily when grass is dormant (approx. Oct-April)

-Blanketing seasonally as weather demands. Blankets will be put on/taken off no more than twice daily (at feeding times). Daytime blanketing will be according to the highest temperature, overnight for the lowest. Blankets will be supplied by boarders. (See basic temperature guidelines below)

-Fly gear (if applicable) applied seasonally at feeding times. Fly spray twice daily in buggy months. Fly spray & gear will be supplied by boarders and labeled with horse's name.

-Veterinary or hoof treatment needed for injury or illness as directed by vet or farrier. Intensive treatment or care requiring stall care shall be billed accordingly in addition to board.

-Holding horses for vet & farrier appointments.

-Use of arena and round pen.

Stall Board

Includes all of the above PLUS

-12 x 12 stall, shavings included, cleaned once daily. If horse is on stall rest for illness or injury, cleaning shall be twice daily. Shavings replenishment shall be at the discretion of staff.

-Individual tack locker for storage.

-Turnout daily with other horses. Field placement is not guaranteed and may change due to horse temperaments or pasture maintenance routines. -Horses in pasture without a shed will be brought in at the discretion of staff for very bad weather.

General Barn Blanketing Guidelines

*Notify staff if you have a different plan for your *horse

Above freezing & dry: Naked Below 60+ rain: lightweight sheet Below 40+ rain: medium weight or sheet + liner Below freezing: medium weight

Blankets are not required. Horses are very capable of overwintering naked, even in very cold climates. Blankets are recommended for senior or underweight horses. Be sure to purchase waterproof blankets appropriate for turnout (with the exception of a liner which is a layering piece).
