ICAM has established the following process for becoming a volunteer in different categories.

<u>Volunteer:</u> If you would like to pursue volunteering with ICAM, please fill out the volunteer <u>form</u>. This is the first step of serving ICAM as volunteer.

<u>Volunteer in the sub committee:</u> Once you are a volunteer for 3-6 months in good standing then a person can become a sub-committee member.

<u>Volunteer as board member:</u> Once you are a volunteer for 6-12 months and served in a committee in good standing then a person can become eligible to apply for a board member position.
