FAVORITE SUMMER RECIPES

We've got 2 new recipes – and both prove to be healthy options – each has oatmeal as a key ingredient. Thank you Barb Hamilton and John Stever! (Judy and I went to Chase Farm and got strawberries today – I am ready to try these 2 yummy recipes!)

Hi Marie, This is my sister-in-law's recipe. She makes this several times during blueberry season and we have been lucky enough to be visiting many times when she has made this. It is especially good with ice cream.

Berry Oatmeal Crumble

2 lbs. of fresh or frozen berries (great with mixed berries)
2 Tbs. granulated sugar
1 Tbs. cornstarch
3 cups old fashioned oats
6 Tbs. melted unsalted butter
1/3 cup honey
1 tsp. ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp. salt

Heat oven to 350 F. In a shallow 2 1/2 qt. baking dish (9 x 13 dish works), toss fruit with sugar and cornstarch. In a large bowl, toss oats, butter, honey, cinnamon and salt just until combined. Scatter over fruit, cover with foil and bake 30 minutes. Remove foil, increase temperature to 400 F and bake until fruit mixture is bubbling and oat mixture is golden brown, 20 to 25 minutes. Enjoy! Hi Marie.

I have a summertime recipe to share. It is something I have just recently discovered. It's called Overnight Oats. The basic recipe is:

Combine in a bowl:

1/2 cup oats 1 tsp. Chia Seeds or ground Flax Seeds

Mix together:

1/2 cup milk or Soy milk 1/4 tsp. Vanilla 1 Tbsp. Maple Syrup

Pour liquid over the dry ingredients and put it in the refrigerator overnight.

Add whatever toppings you want the next morning. I usually add walnuts, blueberries, and raspberries.
