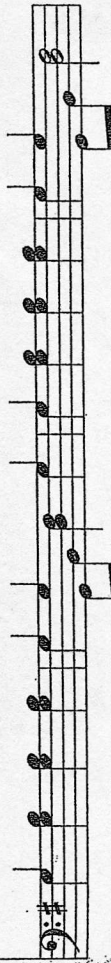

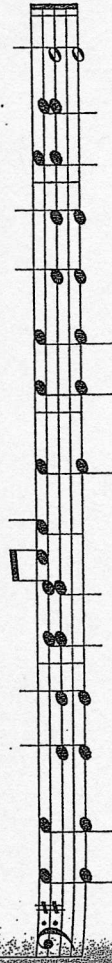

Amazing Grace!

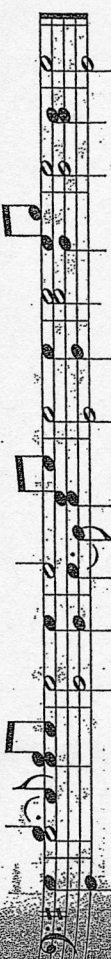
